1965 Shelby Cobra CSX2461

After considering Austin-Healey, Jensen and Bristol, Carroll Shelby heard that AC, builders of the stylish and sturdy Ace-Bristol Sports Cars, had lost their engine supplier when Bristol ceased production. Timing was everything, and in September of 1961 Shelby wrote Charles Hurlock of AC Cars to propose a hybrid car using the AC sports car body and chassis. Hurlock expressed interest "if a suitable V8 could be found", prompting Shelby to move quickly when editor Ray Brock of 'Hot Rod' magazine told him of Ford's new lightweight V-8. It did not take Shelby long to acquire and install an early 221ci variant in a stock AC Ace Bristol.

A late production MK I — or as us 'yanks' refer to it, a '289' — this Cobra — CSX 2461, benefits from the significant evolutionary improvements that were constantly being implemented by both AC Cars, Ltd. and Shelby American, Inc. Rack and pinion steering (replacing the antiquated worm and roller steering system used until CSX 2125), Ford electrical system, including alternator charging vs. the 'stone knife and bearskin' generator along with Stuart Warner gauges (replacing the 'Prince of Darkness' Lucas system used until CSX2200) along with a host of other less readily noticeable improvements from side vents to overall build quality — 'die hard' Shelby Cobra enthusiasts are well aware, the 'late cars are the ones to own'.

Accompanied by a well documented ownership history (detailed on pages 262 and 263) of the new Shelby American World Registry – including the prestigious collection of Mr. Otis Chandler (of the Los Angeles Times) featuring completely original sheet metal and original chassis, this is a genuine 'no stories' Cobra. A comprehensive file of detailed restoration photos shows a 100% original 'skin' aluminum bodywork and chassis in bare metal configuration. The over two year restoration attended to every conceivable detail, from an NOS clock and full gauge restoration of the original Stewart-Warner gauges to the correct grain and contours of the original interior. From the highly detailed engine bay (featuring unique aluminum covered foot boxes) and the cosmetically dramatic election of the restorer to equip the 'jewelry' of Weber carburetors to the highly detailed trunk or 'boot' with the correct white gel coated fiberglass spare tire well, correct jack, and original top bows, top, side curtains and original cover.

The roll bar and color combination and side exit exhaust having been installed when this Cobra was almost brand new, the restorer elected to retain these accounterments during the fastidious refurbishment process. Look closely however, to the attention to detail.

From the original (not reproduction) wheel knock off hubs to the NOS grease gun — the correct and original 'grained' Cobra emblems to the original restored 16' steering wheel — from the 'ultra-rare' accessory wood shift knob to the correct rivets in the owner's manual in the glove box, minute details abound. Closely inspect the exceptional brightwork and the mirror image paintwork along with metal finishing by Lon Kruger to ensure body lines and gaps that exist only in the minds of marketing brochures and the dreams of Cobra enthusiasts worldwide.

In addition, the chassis main tubes have been reinforced to alleviate the 'bending', or flex, of any original Cobra. If you have ever had your underarm pinched by the door gap when riding in an original car, you'll know how valuable and important this restoration element is. Suffice it to say, every aspect of this outstanding piece of American automotive history was fastidiously restored with the ultimate in attention to detail, impeccable craftsmanship and a fanatical devotion to originality.

1937 Packard 1501 Super 8 Rumble Seat Coupe

From the outset, the Packard Motor Company relied on making luxurious cars that were highly luxurious and refined while at the same time powered by durable engineering. This belief had placed them among the elite in the diverse automobile industry during the early 1900s. However, as the world entered the Great Depression, Packard was one of very few at or near the top who managed to weather the storm. As the crisis began to abate, however, management rationalized that many potential buyers had dwindled as their personal and business fortunes were lost. From 1929 to 1933, production dropped by nearly half each year when compared with the previous one, yet, seemingly above it all, Packard continued to make improvements each year.

Packard's Ninth Series for 1932 featured many improvements that helped to create a niche apart from other automakers in the industry. These included a revised steering geometry which made steering smooth and easy as well as a new servo-driven, driver-adjustable power assisted braking system. The drivers workload was eased even further with automatic spark advance and a new stove-type choke. These changes also helped Packard attracted a growing segment of female buyers, no less driving enthusiasts than their male counterparts.

In the next years that followed, Packard continued to offer three chassis: Eight, Super Eight and the magnificent Twelve. Both Super Eight and Twelve rested on a wheelbase that measured 142 inches and had a hood that was nearly six-inches longer than the Standard or Deluxe Eight; the fenders were longer as well. Naturally, this allowed the wood and steel composite bodies on these models to be interchangeable. 1936 brought the Fourteenth Series and was a year of 'lasts' - the final year for Bijur lubrication, ride control, a semi-elliptic suspension, mechanical brakes, heavy vibration dampening bumpers and the 384ci inline eight-cylinder engine. However, the future was in sight as well: these cars received a new radiator that was installed at a five-degree angle. The Super 8 had a new sloped grille with chrome vertical bars which gave the vehicle a unique look and served also as thermostatically controlled shutters, opening and closing based on engine heat.


New in many ways, the Fifteenth Series 'Senior' Packards for 1937 were at the top of a much larger family within the brand, as Packard had begun manufacture of smaller cars, named 110 and 120, during the latter part of the year prior. As the representatives of the style and class from the virtual king of luxury automobiles during the period, the Super Eight was a remarkable achievement surpassed by very few other automobiles on the road that year. Finished in Regatta Blue Metallic with an Aluminum Silver stripe over gray wool broadcloth, this 1937 Fifteenth Series Super Eight Rumble Seat Sports Coupe is one of very few Series 1501 cars produced, let alone that managed to survive and be restored to this quality. Recently completed by Glenn Vaughn Restorations in Post Falls, Idaho, this car is in show-ready condition and features desirable options that include Trippe lamps, dual side-mounted spare wheels and covers, the correct luggage rack, heater, a banjo steering wheel and two accessory radiator mascots in addition to the standard radiator cap. Further enhanced for long-term preservation, touring and enjoyment with a stainless-steel exhaust system, this Full CCCA Classic Car would be right at home on a caravan or the show field alike.

















1968 Aston Martin DB6

In October of 1965, Aston Martin introduced the DB6 at the London Motor Show. The DB6 had a more conventional framing for the aluminum outer bodywork, consisting of a steel floor pan and inner body panels at the rear. On of the most visually apparent feature was the truncated Kamm-type tail which aided the car's stability at high speeds. There was also a slightly higher roofline which improved passenger space in combination with a slightly longer wheelbase that provided additional luggage capacity.

The styling carried over from the DB5 in the front remained virtually intact, with the sole addition of a chin-type air scoop adding additional oil cooling. Other styling updates included quarter bumpers on all four corners, as opposed to the previous full-width units. The four litre inline six-cylinder engine produced 282 horsepower thanks to dual overhead camshafts and three SU carburetors and was coupled to a ZF five-speed manual gearbox. To keep all of this power under control, four-wheel hydraulic disc brakes could bring these Astons to a quick and steady stop.

Finished in black over a matching black leather interior trimmed out with Wilton wool carpets, the 1968 Aston Martin DB6 Saloon offered here was originally owned by none other than Volkswagen AG President Heinrich Nordhoff. The car was originally delivered to Germany for his use and was nicely optioned for inclement weather with a heated rear window, power aerial, chrome Dunlop wire wheels with three-ear knockoff spinners and a limited slip differential. The car passed into its second ownership in 1986 when a Hamburg film producer acquired the car. The car remains in excellent condition following a comprehensive restoration and unlike many of these cars stateside never required conversion from the homemarket's right-hand-drive configuration.

The definitive statement of style and sophistication could not be more embodied within one automotive manufacturer and the art of their design and engineering prowess than David Brown's Aston Martin. The legendary sporting icon of British performance and class, having graced the fortunate and wealthy from fiction to reality — from James Bond to Greta Garbot, form Silver Screen to Country Club, the Aston Martin DB series has long set the standard for GT aficionados the world over.

Originally commissioned by the Chairman of Volkswagen in Germany — the rare configuration of left hand drive is as delivered when new to this prestigious first owner. Befitting of its German heritage, the current livery is stunningly austere with gloss black paintwork over black interior hides. Recent cosmetic attention to detail includes fresh brightwork, new grille, emblems, interior leather and wool carpets, wheels along with a full suspension rebuild incluing all bushings, hydraulics and a rare set of original NOS electronically adjustable rear shock absorbers.

In addition, a robust file of documents and photos details a fastidious ownership and restoration history. Outfitted with original owners manual, shop manual, and accompanying tool kit — the minute details indicative of this investment caliber automobile are present and accounted for. Having successfully participated in both vintage driving events and displayed on the Concours show field, this fabulous example is prepared to well serve the new fortunate owner who will enjoy granting it custody.

1971 Mercedes Benz 280SE 3.5 Convertible

When introduced in the early 1960s, all Mercedes-Benz W111-chassis 'S-Class' cars were powered by the company's reliable 6-cylinder engine. Displacing just over 2.2 liters with a cross-flow cylinder head and overhead camshaft, their performance can only be described as stately. Later developments in engineering as well as the introduction of the W108 chassis that replaced the W111 sedans also influenced the styling of higher-displacement coupes and cabriolets. However, despite another few increases in power, the high-priced 280SE with a top that went down was still not competitive.

That reputation for solidly-built but lackluster-performing automobiles changed dramatically when the 230-horsepower, 3.5-liter V-8 was introduced in Germany for the 1970 model year. This car offered mighty performance to match its grand-touring, if not sporting, stance. Based on numerous developments that stemmed in no small part from the W100 and W109s 6.3 liter V-8 introduced a few years earlier, the W111 280SE chassis was up to the power. Like its predecessors, the body structure was of unitized construction. Mercedes had perfected its independent front suspension with coil springs and refined its low-pivot swing-axle independent rear. The result was a solid, rigid, quiet and stiff platform that was ideally suited to form the base of a luxury automobile.

The success of the first V-8 cars were built on the strong foundation from better US marketing of Mercedes' S-Class cars that really took off in earnest with the introduction of the 111-series 220SEb coupes and convertibles for the 1962 model year. The 1962 220SEb evolved, almost without visual changes, into the 250SE, and then the 280SE coupes and convertibles. The conservative styling did not include the vestigial tail fins of the period sedans, and endured right up to 1970, when Mercedes lowered the front grille a bit and created the all-aluminum, 3.5-liter overhead-cam V-8 powered car that would be produced in limited numbers for the next two years, yet for only one of these were the cars exported to the pivotal US market.

Featured here is a stunning example of a 1971 Mercedes-Benz 280SE 3.5. Recently professionally restored in the correct factory 'mittelblau' metallic over Saddle Roser leather with acres of burl-walnut trim and a contrasting Haartz cloth convertible top, the results are nothing short of stunning, understated opulence combined with the power, handling and ride comfort this generation of Mercedes-Benz automobiles are known for. As all 802 examples that reached the United States were equipped, this car features factory-installed Behr air-conditioning, a Becker Europa stereo radio, dash-mounted clock, power-windows, vacuum-operated power locks and much more. As remarked on by marque specialist Alex Dearborn, 'The enthusiast would have a hard time finding a collectible car so thoroughly modern and easy to use. With their snug-fitting six-layer convertible tops, excellent sound-deadening, and quiet V-8s, they can cruise the interstates at today's elevated speeds, delivering four people to their weekend destinations in better comfort than many new cars. Service and parts are easy to obtain through hundreds of knowledgeable dealers and independent shops.'

If you have been looking for the right and correct one of these to buy in an understated and uncommon color combination such as this one, you would be hard-pressed to acquire a better example.




















1966 Lamborghini 350GT Early Production

The 350/400 GT Series represent Lamborghini's intention to construct the finest Grand Touring automobiles ever assembled. Many automotive journalists at the time hailed the cars as being better than equivalent exotic machinery. During its introductory year, only thirteen examples of the 350 GT version were created. Around 120 examples were created in total and all were mostly hand-built. Of these rare cars, very few survivors remain in the same condition as chassis 148, the car on offer here. Finished in a lustrous black over tan leather hides and riding on Borrani knockoff wire wheels, this remarkable early Lamborghini was restored comprehensively inside and out. From its trademark oval Cibie headlamps to the early three and a half litre Bizzarrini-designed V-12 engine, no detail or element was overlooked in bringing this exquisite car back to the standards to which it was originally built.

An active invited participant in the highly demanding Concours d'Elegance circuit, this outstanding early production 350 GT has received multiple best in class awards indicative of it stunning quality of workmanship, attention to detail, and dramatic presentation.

A comprehensive restoration portfolio details a pilgrimage to achieve the objective you now see utilizing the very best of the best of both materials and craftsmanship. Mechanicals attended to by noted authority Mr. Bob Wallace, brighwork by Christensen Plating and interior by Dubuque Trim — no detail has been left unattended.

The early production nature of this feature car has many unique features. Although the serial numbers of the first cars were not in consecutive order — and no records have been discovered that divulge the actual build sequence — several components clearly indicate this is one of the very first produced. Most notably, the unique early production feature of the 'engine turned' machined steering wheel and dash surround.

Unlike the later production 400's early 350GT's featured all alloy coachwork by Touring employing their patented and unique "Superleggera" build process. As you can imagine, the Italian pride of Ferruccio Lamborghini was in full bloom with the early cars as his "baby" was closely scrutinized and resulted in glowing reviews from the press corps. Many features of the 350GT were state of the art, and remain avant garde even by today's standards. For example; every piece of glass on the car has compound curves. From tiny, almost invisible A pillars, to the simplistic art deco rear view mirror, the lines of the body work continually transform into different sensuous shapes each time the car is viewed from various angles. The objective to create the ultimate touring car, for exclusivity, speed, comfort and ultimate enjoyment of the driver and fortunate occupant were dramatically achieved in what is now heralded as one of automotive design and engineering's greatest achievements.

1959 AC Ace Bristol

AC Cars' Ace debuted in 1953 at the London Motor Show and was produced from 1954 to 1963. The vehicle consisted of light-weight tubular chassis with steel boxes in the front and rear which supported an transverse leaf and lower wishbone independent suspension system. The chassis was designed by John Tojeiro and power was initially provided by a Welleter-designed engine and was mounted in the front of the vehicle but placed back far enough to take advantage of balance. The body and design of the vehicle was inspired by the 2-seater Ferrari 166MM Barchetta made by Touring of Milan.

During the first year of production, there were fewer than 60 examples produced. These were all Aces - convertibles. The Aceca, a hard top variant debuted in 1954. Due to the vehicles light weight, optimal weight distribution, responsive engine and handling, and stylish appearance, it attracted much attention. In 1956 the Bristol-engine version was introduced, replacing the Welleter-designed motor. The Bristol 1971 cc, six cylinder engine was capable of producing 125 horsepower at 5750 rpm and propelling the light-weight car to a top speed of around 180 kph. The vehicles came equipped with front disc brakes, Girling hydraulic shock absorbers, rackand-pinion steering, and a four-speed manual transmission.

Sold new in Los Angeles, this lovely 1959 AC Ace comes with its original 100D engine and factory disc brakes. As evidence of its origins, it retains the original, black California license plate it has worn for over half a century. From new, the car participated in many Southern California events including the Willow Springs Hill Climb in 1959 and was purchased from only its second owner about three years ago in amazingly-original condition. Since that time, this rare and remarkable car has undergone a complete body-off restoration.

Known as the basis for Shelby's famous Cobras a few years later, those who appreciate the origins of that car cannot miss such a fine and storied example as this.

1967 Ferrari 330 GTC

Axfew short years following the release of Ferrari's 330 GT 2+2, a gentleman's express Berlinetta was designed to fill the gap between the more-relaxed four-seater and the 275GTB, Ferrari's road-going racing-machine of the day. Debuting at the 1966 Geneva Motor Show, the new 330 GTC's lines were largely inspired by the 500 Superfast up front, while the car's aft styling cues were perhaps most similar to those found on the 275 GTS Spyder. Carrying over from the GT, the 4.0-liter, two-cam, 60-degree Colombo V-12 with 300 horsepower at its disposal rested on a wheelbase that measured a short 94.5-inches comprised of a steel space frame. Independent front and rear suspension was similar to prior cars with double wishbones and coil springs. Again as before, the five-speed transaxle was incorporated into the rear suspension, similar to the design introduced on the road-going Ferrari 275GTB in 1964.

Offered here is a well-documented and attractive example of the 1967 330 GTC. Completed in November of 1967 and delivered when new to Italy in February of 1968, the car was shortly thereafter shipped to the western United States where it spent most of its life in Arizona and California. By 1990, the incredibly original car had traversed just 66,000 kilometers from new and its outstanding condition was confirmed during a pre-purchase inspection by famed Ferrari Concours Judge Patrick Ottis, who proclaimed it to be 'among the most original 330 GTCs [he had] ever seen'. Later that year, Ottis performed a top-end engine rebuild, an overhaul of the transaxle and a chassis servicing, while a following owner performed a comprehensive engine overhaul a full decade later. To document this work, the car comes with well-over \$40,000 in receipts. The car has a tidy mechanical appearance, and shows all the signs of proper mechanical upkeep. Like the engine bay, the underside is not freshly detailed but one is assured that it has been well looked-after mechanically. To date, this car drives very well; it starts easily and has good power with minimal smoke and that wonderful V-12 exhaust note.

Benefiting from fresh re-spray to mirror image perfection along with new bright work including bumpers and a full cosmetic detail, the body was found to be exceptionally straight with even gaps, requiring virtually no repairs. Inside, the car's interior was re-trimmed later that decade in grey hides and black wool carpeting; the seats, headliner, dash, and door panels all have a fresh look and are free of any major blemishes. Like the interior, the trunk was reupholstered in high quality black wool carpeting and has a fresh look to it. With this example comes copious documentation for the current ownership period and before, copies of the factory build sheets, a reprinted owner's manual, the original spare wheel and tire and a very complete replacement tool roll in like-new condition.

Widely regarded to be one of the best driving and most usable classic Ferraris, the 330 GTC remains a sought-after car for long tours and rallies. The 4 liter Colombo V-12 engine's wide torque band combined with the inherent balance exhibited by the chassis engineering makes this not only a joy to own but to use as it was intended.

1953 BMW 327/2 Cabriolet

The BMW 327 Cabriolet was produced between 1937 and 1941 and was a favorite of many German officers and government officials. Manufactured in Eisenach, Germany at BMW's primary automobile production plant, the war-ravaged operation found itself in the Soviet sector after WW II. The factory was reopened by the occupying Soviets and captured German engineers at this time and by the late 1940s again began producing BMW cars. BMW, now headquartered in Munich, sued the Eisenach company and won forcing the name change to EMW by the early-1950s.

This car was originally built in 1952 as a BMW 327/2 - this model later came to be called the EMW 327/2. Only 400 of the BMW/EMW's were built before the plant was converted to manufacture cars more suitable to a Communist state. This example is one of the best out of the few that remain and was restored by Maniford Browdowski in Gutenswil, Switerland, one of the world's foremost restorer of classic BMWs.

The restoration was a complete frame off restoration taking over a year and a half to complete. Brodowski's attention to detail involved fabricating duplicate headlight rims, tail light assembly and having a glass blower in The Czech Republic create the headlight lens to the original spec. 

Owned by the current vendor for over thirty years, this very special 1956 Lotus Eleven Le Mans was initially acquired as a partial trade for restoration work that performed on a customer's Packard. Almost completely stock and original throughout, components were cleaned, painted, upholstered, rebuilt and worked on over the years, but never deviated from original specifications.

Always kept titled and licensed for street use, he sparingly entered this special car in the odd vintage race over the decades. In the 1980's, the engine blew during a race. That engine was Coventry Climax FWA 6794 that conveys with the car, while the car now runs FWA 6893. Later, Lotus was the featured marque at the 1995 Monterey historics and for that event a cosmetic restoration was performed, during which time Bob Yarwood Engineering rebuilt the 1098cc engine using the last of the OEM AE/ Hepolite pistons. The transmission was overhauled with Jack Knight internals at the same time.

Notably, he drove it through the night from Seattle to Laguna Seca, competed and raced, and drove it back home to Seattle - an easy 2000 mile road trip in a 1956 Lotus Eleven!

Without argument one of the most-original and non-improved examples of the Lotus Eleven Le Mans that looks, runs, accelerates and drives like it did in 1956, this top-tier collectible or vintage racing contender has some of the most remarkable history from three decades of ownership to go with it.









This 1964 Bentley Continental Drop-Head Coupé with coachwork by H.J. Mulliner, Park Ward was a very exclusive coach-built automobile. The firms of H.J. Mulliner Park Ward and James Young all offered bodies on the Continental S2 chassis that differed greatly from the standard version by virtue of its four-leading-shoe front brakes, shorter radiator and, up to chassis number 'BC99BY', higher gearing.

By far the most striking of the S2 Continentals were those bodied by Rolls Royce's more-or-less in-house coachbuilder Mulliner of Park Ward. This design by Norwegian Vilhelm Koren, with its influential continuous front-to-rear wing line, would continue on the Continental S3. Quad headlamps were the S3's major styling innovation, and on the Mulliner Continental were contained in slanting nacelles, giving rise to this model's 'Chinese Eye' soubriquet.

Only 312 Bentley S3 Contintental of all types were produced. The car offered here, chassis number BC8XC, is one of a mere 76 of its type bodied by Mulliner, Park Ward after the merger of the two coachbuilders. This vehicle was ordered new by Rolls-Royce agent H. R. Owen Ltd for one H.O.H. Silley of Royal Albert Dock, London and was delivered on December 16, 1963. It has since been repainted a lovely deep burgundy over matching merlot leather during a cosmetic restoration. This wonderful Bentley Continental is offered on a State of California Certificate of Title and is ready to enjoy today.









This very-rare Dick Harrell 'Super Camaro' was a 396 cubic-inch, 375 horsepower car that was ordered by Dick Harrell and Fred Gibb Chevrolet. It was then converted to a 427 short block. Only 10 of these were built with a Super Camaro package and this is one of only two in this color. These came with the biggest cam and gear packages, the rare Stinger hood option and the Kelsey-Hayes wheels. This car was one of two in Rally Green with the full cosmetic and performance treatment. These particular Camaros are incredibly rare; the hood is unique and so are the wheels. These cars cannot be duplicated to make a clone. They have special badging, valve covers, emblems, traction bars and much more.

Dick Harrell was the father of the COPO and the ZL1's and also made the Yenko cars but left after a dispute with Don Yenko. He was later involved with other dealers like Nickey Chevrolet in Chicago as well as Fred Gibb who loved racing and the new Camaro models. Fred Gibb and Dick Harrell were the equivalent of 'Mr. Norm' in the Chevy world. Having been rotisserie restored back to the way it came from them, it is today considerably more than as-built originally, essentially-equivalent to a Phase III from Baldwin Motion.

Only 636 Shelby Mustangs were sold as 1970 models, of which 350 were GT-350s and 286 were GT-500s. The Shelby Mustang had gradually transformed from a highly successful race car, the first American race car to win an international race, to an overweight and underpowered production car posing as a race car. In 1970 Caroll Shelby turned away from the car production business and Lee lacocca was promoted to president of the Ford Motor Company and so the paths of the two men who started the Mustang muscle car craze parted.

This beautiful Shelby GT500 sports an R-Code, 428 Cobra Jet engine with an automatic transmission. Sporting a fresh concoursquality restoration, it is finished in the correct Silver Jade over a black interior. Factory options include power disc brakes, power steering, tilt wheel, air conditioning and AM/FM radio. Documentation is comprehensive and includes the original Ford order invoice, owners manual and numerous Ford documents. An Elite Marti report confirms all of the above, along with the pertinent fact that only 54 GT 500 convertibles were built with an automatic transmission and only one car was painted Silver Jade. 




The pinnacle of style, fun and flat-out performance from the C2 era is not hard to determine, for it ranks high on the wish lists of all Corvette enthusiasts. Offered here is a stunning example of such a car. This 1967 Corvette convertible features nothing less than its numbers-matching L71 427 cubic-inch, 435 horsepower engine, Muncie M22 4-speed manual and 4.11:1-geared differential. Restored body-off with no expense spared, it was completed in May of 2007 and went on to win its Bloomington Gold Certificate the following month, the paperwork for which conveys with the car. Its exceptional originality stems from having been stored from the 1980s until restoration began almost 20 years later; a letter documenting the detail of originality discovered by the professional restorer also conveys. It is finished in its original Tuxedo Black over a black interior and matching convertible top, a very uncommon period color combination. Additionally unusual, it was intentionally ordered when new without power steering or power windows, for they added unnecessary weight to the car. Options the car did come with and that remain are the factory side pipes, heavy-duty suspension and transistorized ignition, further indication that the original owner who ordered such a car was a true enthusiast.

With tremendous attention to detail and a desirable configuration from new, a modern enthusiast could find few better to match this blue-chip Corvette masterpiece anywhere.











Offered here is one of the final Shelby GT500s produced in the model's last year of manufacture. Not only is this a Shelby Mustang, this car also has the factory "Drag Pack" option, including the 428 Super Cobra Jet engine and a four-speed manual transmission. The SCJ mill featured "Le Mans" rods and a few other small changes for durability. The Drag Pack also included a choice of two different rear end gears; this car has the 3.90:1 gear set rather than the drag-racing-only 4.30:1 option. It continues to wear the rare special-order Screaming Yellow hue in which it was ordered and this amazingly-original example was just been refinished in its original color and extreme care was taken throughout to keep as much original as possible.

The car was purchased brand new from Gotham Ford in Manhattan and has remained in the care of one family since then. With just over 48,000 original miles, it has never been wrecked or modified. All paperwork from the original title and 'Monroney' sticker to many other original documents including a letter from the owner attesting to the car's authenticity convey with the car. The decals on the side window are reproductions with the original glass (and stickers) preserved off the car.

With fantastic history and many original features, this last-year Shelby GT-500 then as now remains a book-end in the index of muscle car performance history. Ready to show or perform again, its sale represents a unique opportunity to any serious collector.

1961 Chrysler 300G Convertible









Officially offered for sale on February 10, 1955, the first Chrysler 300 was athletic-looking. With 300 horsepower aboard, it was among the quickest cars of its time, getting to 60 mph in just 9.8 seconds. Though styling was certainly what drew most buyers into showrooms, 300 'letter series' cars also offered a number of impressive engineering feats, most notably a fully-unitized construction by 1960. These cars were the vehicles that rekindled interest in performance among major American manufacturers after World War II and thus can be considered the muscle car's ancestors, though much more expensive and exclusive.

This beautifully restored 1961 300G Convertible features the unmistakable tailfins of the 'Forward Look' era. The 1961 300G was the epitome of luxury and style merged with exceptional performance. Well ahead of its time and one of only approximately 200 equipped with factory air conditioning, only 50 of these vehicles are known to still exist today, making this car one of the most desirable vehicles of its era among the collector automobile community. This is an outstanding example as well as a great investment that would enhance any collection.



Though they were more conservatively expressed, the newest evolution of Chevrolet's Corvette for the 1980s kept many of the previous-generation C3's styling themes on its release to the public. Significantly improved throughout however, everything mechanical on the C4 Corvette was updated; the car used composite transverse leaf springs both front and back as well as a large aluminum C-section beam. For the first time, Corvette's steering was by rack-and-pinion and as since 1965 the fourwheel disc brakes were enlarged once again.

Without argument, the 1985 Chevrolet Corvette Show Car offered here is the most stylishly-customized and highest-performance example of its type in existence. Over \$300,000 and well-over 4,000 hours have been carefully invested into this dream car. Known on the International Show Car Association circuit as 'The General', it has ranked number-one in that organization's Sports Car classification on the entire North American continent the last two years as well as the number one Custom for the Western United States in 2008. Immaculate in every aspect - from all of its hand-made custom parts to over 1,400 pieces of chrome, custom paint, seats, interior, stereo and much more - this Trophy Car comes with a 20'x 20' elevated indoor/outdoor custom display and a 2008 24-foot trailer. Powered by a supercharged 383ci 'Street Kill' Beck Racing V-8 that puts out an amazing 812 horsepower and 802 ft/lbs of torque, the car is finished in a unique blue-and-black flame paint job with a black leather interior and much, much more.









Forty-five years after he introduced the original Ford Mustang, auto industry visionary Lee Iacocca unveiled his new version of the famous muscle car — the Iacocca 45th Anniversary Edition Ford Mustang. Offered here is car #37 out of the limited production of only 45.

Nearly two years in the making, the lacocca Silver Edition Mustang is a collaborative effort by Lee lacocca, designer Michael Leone, and the Gaffoglio Family Metalcrafters. These unique 2009 Mustangs were uniquely modified and essentially coach-built automobiles built to perpetuate the lacocca mystique. The car sports lacocca Design 20" Chrome wheels with "I" Design Badge, sunken headlights, slanted grille and a special lowered stance for "street attitude". Mechanically, the car's underpinnings are true American muscle with a 300 horsepower Ford 4.6-liter V-8, a 5-speed manual transmission, Ford Racing's Handling Package and an upgraded suspension.

Inside, the car's interior is resplendent with lacocca Diamond Design embroidered leather seats, signature dash plaque with serial number, a leather-wrapped steering wheel with a matching "I" badge to that found in the interior and lacocca-badged aluminum door sill plates.



1915 Van Blerck Special Speedster

This true one-off masterpiece of automotive craftsmanship uses a 200-plus horsepower, 17 litre T-head six cylinder engine that was built in 1915 by Van Blerck, a famous marine engine builder in Michigan who built high-performance engines for the wooden Hacker craft raceboats for the rich and famous.

The massive engine fires using 3 spark plugs per cylinder, while the pistons are the size of a 2-pound coffee can! The thundering sound that results is as special as the engine and the car itself. Built on a pre-1920's chain-drive Fire Truck chassis, the combination of machine and rolling stock has been expertly modified by it's famous California craftsman and builder Gary Wales to accept disc brakes and even carefully-hidden power steering that helps stop and turn the huge tires. It spits out sparks and shoots out flames periodically and makes your window shake just idling in front of your home.

The 19-foot-long sleek race car body is complimented by a beautiful dash full of gold dials and period switches - and there's lots of brass parts under the hood as well as outside to include a huge period spotlight. The engine's carburetor is located on the outside on the right-hand side, and is wrapped with copper lines coming in and out. The sheer size alone of this custom racer is just as impressive. With an overall length of 214", a height of 74" (that's over 6 ft.) tall and with a 163" wheelbase, it is guaranteed to impress!









The AC Ace was developed from a racer designed by John Tojeiro and was modeled after the touring-bodied Ferrari Barchetta (which today sell for in excess of \$1 million). The AC Aces gained their superb road-holding ability with transverse leaf springs at front and rear, fastened at their center and supporting independently mounted wheels at their ends. Bristol-powered Aces were prepped for racing by tuner Ken Rudd.

There were only 463 AC Ace Bristols produced between 1956 and 1964; they are rarer than Cobras. This car built by AC Cars Ltd., Thames Ditton, Surrey, England bears the chassis number BEX 397, and left the factory on the 10th of January 1958. It was shipped to Houston Continental Motors Ltd. and was purchased and delivered to the first owner in La Marque, Texas on August 22, 1958. This was one of only 107 produced and sold worldwide that year and has been registered with Ace Bristol Registrar, Tony Bancroft of the AC Owners Club Limited, in Surrey, England.

This particular car could rightfully be called the ACE of Spades! It is now powered by a new Alan Root aluminum-block Ford 347 cubic-inch V-8, with AFR CNC-ported aluminum heads and four 40-IDA Weber carburetors. Behind the 450-500 horsepower powerplant (approximately four times the horsepower of the original 100D engine) is a Tremec 5-Speed TCET-4617 (TKO-600) Road Racing transmission with ratios: 2.87, 1.89, 1.28, 1.0, 0.82. The resulting power to weight ratio in this car is amazing.









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1969 Shelby GT500 Convertible

One of just twelve produced with Silver Jade paint over a white interior and one of only two in this configuration, this 1969 Shelby GT500 started life as a Shelby Automotive Marketing show car and promotional vehicle that was later sold to Gloria Haley, sister of Jack Haley - most famous for his role as the Tin Man in 'The Wizard Of Oz'.

Restored from a rust-free, zero-accident damage and all-original undamaged Shelby injected fiberglass as well as the original numbers-matching drivetrain, this may be the best car this particular restoration shop were able to start with - including Carroll's personal 1969 that they did a few years ago and that sold for a record \$750,000. The restorers performed a complete nut and bolt restoration including all NOS Ford and Shelby parts wherever needed. All the details were sweated to make this one of the best Shelby convertibles ever made available for sale.

This very car, Shelby serial number 841, was used as a Ford/Shelby dealer show and promo car for the Northern California Ford dealers sales region. Later, it was used as an executive car by the Shelby Automotive corporate council. Following this stint as a 'brass hat' car, it was sold by Cutter Ford to its first owner, Beverly Hills socialite and author Gloria Haley and her husband Bill Parnassus, the LA County Coroner. According to Gloria's nephew, notables that rode in this car included her Father, 'Tin Man' Jack Haley, Liza Minelli and others. Gloria was known as the Little Old Lady from Beverly Hills with her Hot Shelby Cobra. Later, the car was sold to one Robert Lassoff of Beverly Hills and then to one Jim Cowles of Green Bay, WI.

Proposed for a special show car built in 1952 to mark Cadillac's Golden Anniversary, the name Eldorado was the result of an in-house competition won by Mary-Ann Zukosky, a secretary in the company's merchandising department. Another source, Palm Springs Life magazine, attributes the name to a resort destination in California's Coachella Valley that was a favorite of General Motors executives, the Eldorado Country Club.

Offered here is a stunning example of a 1957 Cadillac Eldorado Convertible. Benefiting from a fresh nut-and-bolt frame-off restoration that spared no expense, this prized collectors piece was completed after thousands of man hours this past March by well-known marque expert Bud Ward of Little Rock, Arkansas. Powered by the 325 horsepower, 365 cubic-inch V-8 engine that sports two four-barrel carburetors and is topped off by GM's trademark 'Bat Wing' air cleaners, its' highly-detailed engine compartment is just as meticulously executed as its brilliant Mandalay Red exterior and sumptuous matching leather-upholstered interior, Kelsey-Hayes polished aluminum polished wheels, show-quality chrome and much more. As were most Eldorados, this particular car was very-well optioned from new and includes the Autronic Eye automatic headlight dimmer, the factory 'Wonderbar' signal-seeking AM radio and, of course, the iconic Cadillac 3-piece parade boot.











It was late in the 1968 Trans-Am season at Riverside in California that Jerry Titus announced he would depart Ford to form a new team, TG Racing, with partner Terry Godsall. This venture was supported by a latecomer to the Trans-Am series, GM's Pontiac Motor Division. Pontiac agreed to provide cars for the following season and Jerry would become Builder, Chief Mechanic, Team Manager and Driver. However, as the 1968 season was not yet over, Titus was eager to re-enter the fight with his new team and sponsors.

Offered for sale here is the actual TG Racing Pontiac Firebird that competed in the '68 Trans Am season and was driven to victory by Jerry Titus in the 1969 24 Hours of Daytona. The car was restored and race prepared by Bill Elliott Racing and has been certified by the Historic Trans Am Group with multiple honors to compete in many of the world's most prestigious vintage racing events including the Monterey Historic Automobile Races, Coronado Speed Festival, Wine Country Classic, and the Goodwood Festival of Speed. A biography of the car was published in Hemmings. Additional information and period photos can be found in Dave Friedman's seminal book on the era, Trans Am, The Pony Car Wars, 1966-1972. The car's provenance includes letters from Rick Titus, son of Jerry, a copy of a California DMV title in Rick's name and a Certificate, authenticating and accepting the car from the Historic Trans Am Race Group.

This spectacular 1966 Shelby GT350 was first shipped to Jack Loftus Ford in Hinsdale, IL on February 3, 2008 where it was delivered to its first owner. This service included new Koni shocks, dual exhaust, tires and much more, bringing this awesome motorcar to near museum quality! This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to acquire what we believe to be one of the finest examples of an authentic Shelby GT350 on the market today. It is with great pride and enthusiasm that we offer this great marquee to the most discriminating museum, collector or enthusiast who has an interest in purchasing a piece of American motoring history.









This is the Wally Knoch of NHRA World Record fame 1970 A-990 race-ready Hemi 'Cuda. It is a true one-off example. The car was built for Knoch under his supervision and direction and was featured in popular Hot Rodding magazines when completed under the heading "Heart Transplant" and is also featured in the book "Hemi, The Ultimate V-8" by Robert Genat.

The car was discovered in Walt Knoch's Auto Supply in Detroit and was restored to its original glory as originally built. It contains a very rare 426 cubic-inch A990 race Hemi engine that was completely rebuilt by Eddie McFedders that maintains its entire factory race original aluminum heads. In addition, the aluminum factory water pump, original magnesium dual four intakes and the original numbered dual four-barrel carbs and distributor are also present.

This is a significant rare race Hemi for any collection or museum. All articles and history will be displayed with the car.















The 1969 Dodge Charger 500 offered here is one of just 116 examples built with the massive 426 cubic-inch Hemi engine. Delivered new at John Ryan Dodge in Green Bay, Wisconsin in the configuration seen here today, it was at one point was owned by originality and Mopar certification expert Galen Govier. The car conveys with its original build sheet as well as the fender tag that documents the car's originality to date.

Atop the 425 horsepower, 426 cubic-inch Hemi engine sits a pair of massive dual-quad Carter carburetors, while coupled to its rear, the indestructible Torque-Flite automatic transmission with the correct heavy-duty internals and the Super Trac-Pack rear end offered latter-day street racers quicker shifts and acceleration from stoplight to stoplight.

Apart from details such as the headliner and carpeting, most of the car is original. The exterior finish was done to an incredibly high-quality and remains the correct Chrysler B5 Bright Blue Metallic over a blue interior. While the car does not retain its original numbers-matching Hemi engine, it is one that is correct to this car; even the block shows all of the correct stamping numbers and it has a correct casting date, the 30th of September, 1968 that corresponds to the car's production date of the 28th of November of that same year.

This car is number 53 in the Chrysler Registry out of only 79 examples known to exist and represents a historically-significant Mopar muscle car rarely seen let alone for sale.











Frank and Morris Eckhart of Auburn, Indiana started the Auburn Motor Company in 1903. As their business grew, they acquired more dealerships to stay ahead of the competition, but by the mid-twenties size had caught up with them and they were in need of new leadership. In 1925 E.L. Cord became general manager and set out to save the company. Under Cord the new Auburn became a very different company, emphasizing style and performance. Body styles were changed every few years to keep sales up.

This highly restored 1931 Auburn 898-A Cabriolet exhibits the talents of designers Gordon Buehrig and Alan Leamy who inspired some of the most stunning examples offered by Auburn. This car is equpped with its original 268.8cid Lycoming 8-cylinder engine producing 98 h.p., and three-speed synchromesh manual transmission. Recognized as a full classic by the Classic Car Club of America, this rare automobile represents an outstanding example 1930's American automotive history! This investment quality Auburn drives and performs as nicely as it looks.

Restored by noted marque expert Randy Ema, this exceptional Custom Eight Cabriolet was treated to a full Concours-quality frame-off restoration performed to his exacting standards. Every nut and bolt was redone, no expense was spared and no corners were cut in any area of the car's reconstruction or its ability to make a statement at the center of any presentation. Having traveled just 154 miles since the completion of restoration, it is ready to compete at any level.









The Continental series of automobiles were known for their extraordinary styling and high performance. Later examples such as this car were fitted with a chrome strip along the side of the bodywork, which provided a more balanced profile for the Bentley. Beneath the bonnet, the tried-and-true Rolls-Royce OHV eight-cylinder engine displaces 6.23 liters and was fitted with two SU carburetors, resulting in around 200 horsepower through a heavy-duty Hydramatic four-speed automatic transmission.

The most-obvious changes from Bentley's S2 included the adoption of a four-headlamp arrangement, the absence of side-lights from the wing tops, and a slightly lower radiator shell. James Young Limited and the now combined firm of H.J. Mulliner, Park Ward Limited continued to offer designs on the Continental chassis, and for the first time these were sanctioned on the equivalent Rolls Royce, the Silver Cloud III. Bentley's Continental now differed from the standard and Koren-designed coupes produced by Mulliner, Park Ward; known as the 'Chinese-Eye' models, they were so-called because of their slanting headlamp design.

One of just twenty-eight examples ever built, this 1965 Bentley S3 Park Ward Convertible sports chassis number BC20LXD and was ordered new by one P. Weiller of Switzerland. Finished in a very elegant light blue over black hides, this convertible is a fine example of British motoring excellence. The car has been well-maintained and cared for and is in very sound condition, representing a rare chance to own one of the most desirable post-war body styles ever built.

1962 Pontiac Catalina Super Duty









Late in the model year, Pontiac applied pieces of 389ci Super Duty hardware to about a dozen 421ci V-8s that were intended for dragstrip duty. Furthermore, Pontiac offered a wide range of performance modifications including aluminum front bumpers, radiators and body parts. Pontiac expanded the availability of its Super Duty modifications in order to meet new NHRA rule changes that required engines and body parts for the stock classes to be production options on retail vehicles. Therefore, the very limited Super Duty 421ci V-8 was officially listed as an expensive, limited option on full-size Pontiacs such as the Catalina. Fewer than 180 examples exited the production line for 1962.

Believed to be one of the most original Super Duty Catalinas left in existence, this 1962 Catalina features 85 to 90 percent original paint throughout. The car's original owner purchased it new for a sleeper street racer in Los Angeles, not to drive to work. Featuring a full aluminum race package, the car is absent all conceivable options for weight conservation such as a radio or heater and furthermore sports bucket seats and aluminum front fenders to the same end. Never wrecked or rusted ever, this rare car represents an even rarer opportunity to acquire a real piece of production line ready for competition.

It was a four-time Northeastern SCCA BP Divisional Champion and second overall as late as 1970 at Road Atlanta during the SCCA ARRC National Championships.

After an illustrious career, CSX2009 was purchased by its current owner and restored over a tenyear period into the beautiful car that it is today. The vision for CSX2009 was for it to continue on in competition in a handful of vintage racing series and events, be competitive on the Concours d'Elegance Circuit and at the same time have the bragging rights to a fantastic and unparalleled racing history. Not disappointingly, CSX2009 has been a proven Shelby Concours winner at SAAC13, SAAC32, Newport Beach yet remains a serious 'hot rod' to boot. Cord proceeded to market aggressively the company's unsold inventory and succeeded in completing his buyout before the end of 1925. In 1926, he acquired the Duesenberg Corporation, famous for its bespoke racing automobiles, and would use it as the launching platform for a line of high-priced luxury vehicles.

As the 1920s came to a close, a unique Boat-tail speedster was styled by Al Leamy after drawings by famous Russian emigré Count Alexis deSakhnoffsky. Leamy was a recent addition to Cord's staff and would become famous in the years to come with the radical design of the radical new L-29 automobile.

The Trans-Am Boss 302 was the ultimate road-racing 'pony' car of its time. After a disappointing Trans Am season in 1968, Ford spared no expense in developing the Boss 302 race cars. During the first month or two of 1969, Ford built 10 'plain Jane' Mustang fastbacks, equipped with four speed transmissions as the only option. These were complete cars but had no paint, sealers, or undercoating. The cars were sent to Ford's in-house concept and competition car builder, Kar Kraft, where most of the modifications were done. They were stripped completely down to the last fastener and rebuilt into race cars.

The Boss 302 engines were fully-blueprinted and had O-ringed heads, titanium valves and special heavy duty short blocks to handle the extreme compression and stresses of endurance racing. Atop each engine, two large Holley 1230 CFM Dominator carburetors were fed by fresh air ducted to them from the grill area. On the other side, the engine fed stainless-steel exhaust headers lined up side by side under the car for improved ground clearance and led to large exhaust pipes that dumped out in front of the rear wheels. To bring all of this to a halt, the largest brakes in Ford's parts bin were the four piston binders adapted from the Lincoln division, while rear discs (not a production option on any Fords of the era) were adapted to the rear axle from those found on the front of an early Mustang.

From Kar Kraft, the cars were delivered semi-finished to both Bud Moore and Carroll Shelby. Each team had two primary cars and from two to four backup machines. Kar Kraft would build only three of the cars for the 1969 season; this car, chassis 9F02R-112074 was the second race car prototype built side-by-side with 112073, itself used initially for wind-tunnel testing, a mechanical test car and perhaps most-importantly, Ford's primary media car. As it was needed out on the road, this first prototype did not appear until the fourth event of the season at Bridgehampton where it debuted in the blue livery of the Shelby team while this car, 112074 was built as a one-of-a-kind "Daytona Special" for more immediate use. Unlike its sister car, it was built with 2 inches cut from the radiator support and a wedge taken out of the side panels in the engine compartment. As a consequence of this, the fenders had to be notched around the doors because of the slope of the front sheet metal; double frame rails were also made for it and a NASCAR side fuel fill was fitted as aforementioned.


Consequently, while 112073 was used for testing and promotion, 112074 is of note in that it was the first Boss 302 powered Mustang to participate in competition. Its debut took place at Daytona in February of 1969 at the NASCAR Citrus 250 event under the direction of racing director Bud Moore and driven by Parnelli Jones. As the season progressed, more black and red Ford team cars entered the team's stable, 112074 continued to be driven by both Jones and Follmer during the season, who used their own numbers on the team cars - #15 or #16 - depending on who was driving.


It was this war between Ford's revolutionary new Mustang Boss 302 and Chevrolet's recognizable Camaro Z/28 that made the '69 Trans Am year legendary. While the combined front of both Shelby and Bud Moore-prepared Mustangs were fast, reliable and stout and the Boss 302 engine thrived on preparation and thus high speeds, it was not enough. The Mustangs could only stay close to the Camaros in the manufacturers' championship, even though it must be noted that the Camaros only won half as many races. Ford ended the year second, 64 points to 78.

As one of two of the surviving Bud Moore cars out of six built for the season and the first one to see competition during that season, the car on offer here represents perhaps the ultimate opportunity to acquire the most significant Trans Am Factory Team Car ever available for public sale. In the hands of the current vendor for more than 20 years, it is without a doubt fully-certified, documented, and registered by both the Historic Trans-Am Registry and the Federation International de l'Automobile.

It should also be noted that this car, 112074, was not only used by the Bud Moore squad but also under the direction of Shelby American since both teams took their orders from Ford and as such is listed as a Shelby Trans-Am team car in the Shelby American World Registry. Not only is this the prototype, the Daytona Special but it is indisputably the sole Trans-Am Mustang to enjoy the honor of having been used by both teams.

Today, only 4 1969 Ford or Shelby Team cars survived. They are this one, the later-production #16 car driven primarily by George Follmer and bearing the chassis number 148623 as well as the #1 and #2 Blue Shelby Team cars. While Ford missed the mark of winning the 1969 Trans Am Championship by a narrow margin to the Penske/Donohue Camaro, this icon of motorsports history speaks to the magic that would unfold the following year from the research, engineering, development and success that this car and its siblings helped to inaugurate.


SHIPPING
