Deysel het 19 jaar gelede as 'n private lyfwag gewerk. Die dag van die skietery in Johannesburg was sy taak om 'n man veilig by 'n bank te kry toe gewapende rowers toeslaan

Die laaste ding wat Deysel kon herroep was die gevoel van 'n vuurwapen teen sy rug, gevolg deur die pyn van koeëls wat deur sy lyf skeur en hoe hy dae later in die hospitaal ontwaak.

nart ID card fraud

The department of home affairs has ridiculed allegations of fraud in the issuing of smart ID cards.

Spokesperson Mayihlome Tshwete said the department's Gauteng manager Albert Matsaung had clarified what he meant when he told a parliamentary committee meeting that Minister Malusi Gigaba had intentionally misled the country by implying that no fraud had been detected

'In his presentation, Mr Matsaung clarified the fraud he had alluded to had occurred during applications for the green barcoded identity documents and not during applications for smart ID cards,' he said.

Tshwete said the smart card office confirmed and verified information prior to issuing the smart ID.

This would apply, in particular, to cases in which the applicant is suspected to be a non-South African

"This has been implemented to clean up the national population register (NPR) because previously non-citizens found their way into the system [register] and acquired green barcoded IDs fraudulently.

He said the department had identified offices including Byron's Place in Pretoria in which fraudulently acquired green barcoded IDs had been used to apply for smart ID cards.

'Due to the tightened security which includes the submission of biometrics to collect [an ID], applicants failed to collect their documents when requested to present themselves at the office where they had made their application," said Tshwete. Tshwete said the department maintained

that ID cards were the best solution to problems encountered previously. "The Smart ID card, through its secured

Earlier this week, Rekord reported that some residents were frustrated at the incessant power cuts which occurred as a result of a failing early warning system or late alloca-

> The Tshwane metro has collected nearly R8 billion from the prepaid electricity smart meters which some residents have said have done more harm than good.

"We paused further roll-out of the smart meters after a court case was brought to challenge the procurement process

"However, none of the challenges were proven in court and the case was thrown out," he said

This prompted the Tshwane metro to ar-

range a mutually acceptable termination of the current agreement with service provider, Total Utilities

Management Ser-

vices (TUMS). "However, we remain committed to an ongoing rollout of the prepaid smart meters across the metro because we have seen the benefits. "Hence we will soon be reissuing

a tender for similar services. 'This tender

will be issued on the open market and anyone can

apply," said Bokaba. The metro rubbished claims that the smart

meters were defective, with no warning system of depleted funds and resulted in long waits for restoration of power once funds were allocated.

Bokaba said all customers were provided

with two warning notifications via email or SMS. "This means that the customer has total control of their account at all times.

There is even a portal which any customer has access to through the internet.

"There, they can set and adjust their own threshold values as well as opt in or out of SMS threshold messages.

"They can also maintain and edit their contact details when necessary," said Bokaba. "All customers had ample time to respond to early warning messages urging them to top up in advance before balances reached zero.

"We would expect customers to react to these warnings and take necessary action to avoid disconnection of service."

Bokaba further urged all customers to use the correct reference numbers when topping up an account. "The system will automatically allocate their payment and automatically reconnect the customer within a few minutes of payment being cleared at the bank. For large power users, there are potential health and safety issues associated with automatic reconnection so a controlled manual process has to be done and it takes longer," he said.



Union Buildings turned into a battlefield

A march over rising university fees saw the Union Buildings becoming a battleground between police and protesters.

Thousands of students gathered in Pretoria on Friday for the mass march.

This was preceded by days of mostly peaceful protesting by students at universities throughout the country about the fee issue. But tempers boiled over on Friday.

A band of irate protesters attacked police and journalists, setting fire to the lawn of the Union Buildings and rioting in the city's streets.

Students from University of the Witwatersrand (Wits), University of Pretoria (UP) and Tshwane University of Technology (TUT) all took part in the national #FeesMustFall campaign, demanding that tertiary education fees be scrapped or at least be capped.

On Wednesday and Thursday, UP students peacefully protested on the university campus and in the surrounding streets.

On Friday morning, they were joined by students from Wits and TUT as they marched to the Union Buildings in expectation that President Jacob Zuma would address them and respond to their demands.

dress them and respond to their demands. The march itself was peaceful, as students sang and danced down Jan Shoba (Duncan) Street.

When the protesters arrived at the Union Buildings and were not immediately addressed by Zuma, some became irate, chanting, "Where is Zuma? Where is Zuma?"

Amid rising tension, a group of protesters tore down the metal fence around the Union Buildings and set fire to portable toilets.

Most of the protesters refused to become violent, instead chanting: "Peaceful protest." Peaceful protest."

This did not deter rioters, who started throwing bricks and rocks at police and nearby journalists.

Police kept calm for hours, pushing the rioters back. Eventually they took more drastic measures, firing stun grenades and rubber bullets to disperse the crowd. This only worked for a while as the

This only worked for a while as the protesters quickly returned and made their way to the steps of the Union Buildings, still expecting Zuma to address them.

While the protesters were waiting, Zuma announced on television that a 0% fee increase for 2016 would be put into effect. He also said long-term issues like free education and racism on campuses needed to be addressed. The UP has since announced that needy students would not have to pay the registration fee when registering for 2016.

"Students who qualify for the National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS), students who submit letters from sponsors, and financially needy students who make the necessary financial arrangements with the university, will be allowed to register without paying the initial fee on registration, provided they meet all other criteria," Vice Chancellor Cheryl de la Rey said in a statement.

"In addition, students in financial need who have outstanding residence fees will be considered individually for assistance, should they meet all other residence placement criteria. Also, for students in financial need, the application fee will not be payable during 2016 for the 2017 academic year."

When protesters learnt on Friday that Zuma would not address them, they rioted in streets, setting police cars alight and barricading roads. Those injured in the process were trea-ted by paramedics in the middle of dancing and singing crowds.

The protest continued into the night and eventually died down. Sunnyside police spokesperson Sergant Asnath Malatsi said six protesters were arrested by police on Friday, but were released on Sunday morning without being charged.

On Saturday, some of the peaceful protesters returned to the Union Buildings to help clean up some of the devastation caused by the rioters.

De la Rey confirmed Zuma's announcement of no increase in tertiary tuiton fees next year would put into effect. She said the examination period will also be extended to compensate for time lost during the protest.

"The university appreciates the responsible way in which Tuks students took part in the protest, both on and off campus, and the fact that there was no violence, serious injuries or damage to UP property."

South Africa took part in global commemorations this weekend to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the United Nations (UN).

Saturday, 24 October was UN day and on Sunday pupils from Pretoria schools joined UN staff and Pretoria residents dressed in the UN blue to commemorate the day. The crowd went on a peaceful walk from the UN offices to the Pretoria Technical High School where a variety of activities were scheduled.

These included song and dance, poem reading and speeches.

Speaking on behalf of the UN, Dr Esther Muia paid tribute to support and cooperation between the global body and the SA government.

She also lauded the achievements of the SA government in attaining some millennium development goals.



Although being bitten by a Hungarian spider can be a painful experience, the results do not necessarily have to be all bad.

Don't be surprised if Basson Engelbrecht should be smilling and raring to go when he lines up to compete in the Tongeyong Triath-lon World Cup in South Korea this week.

In a weird way it can be said that a spider has brought about this new and positive approach in Engelbrecht. "Sometimes nearly losing something

about which you are passionate can be a good thing because when you fear that you are going to lose it you suddenly realise how much it means to you," he explained "Being bitten by a spider meant that I was out of action for about eight weeks. I was

not able to compete at the World Championships in Chicago as well as in a few other major events.

This setback meant that I had a lot of time to think. I came to the shocking conclu-sion that if I should be unable to compete and train as a triathlete there would be absolutely nothing left for me," the Tuks/hpc

"You run because you have to run and swim because you have to swim. Not being able to train made me realise how much I enjoyed what I was doing and how privileged I

"It also made me appreciate my Godgiven talents. I can honestly say that I am now hungrier than ever to succeed.'

Engelbrecht's poisonous setback occured in August while he was preparing for the Tiszaujvaros World Cup in Hungary.

The Tuks/hpc athlete said he went for a training run in the veld a few days before the event.

"At some stage I stopped to do some stretching exercises. When I looked down I noticed that my legs were covered with spider webs but I did not think much about it. When I got back to where I stayed I saw a small bite mark.

The next day I went for a swim in a nearby lake which seems to have been a huge mistake. Apparently some bacteria got into the small wound and made my ankle swell to twice its normal size. I could barely walk and went to see a doctor."

He said it was a strange experience because the doctor could not speak English and he had to get somebody to translate.

"I noticed that the doctor looked worried and made all sorts of gestures with his hands while he was explaining to me what was wrong but all the translator had to say was that I was going to be 'OK'

"Not understanding what the doctor said I went ahead and raced, which turned out to be a huge mistake.

Engelbrecht said with quite a good start in the swim he was second when they reached the first buoy, but from then on things started to go the other way.

Within a matter of seconds I was almost last. I started cycling but on the second lap I was a totally spent force and just toppled over," he said

The 20-year-old Engelbrecht's best results so far this year were winning the Le Morne ATU Sprint Triathlon African Cup race and finishing third in the Sharm El Sheikh ATU Triathlon African and Pan Arab Championships

Wenda Nel coaches keen special stars

The quest to run ever-faster times in an effort to become one of the best 400-hurdles athletes in the world is not Wenda Nel's only passion

To help others is equally important to her. It was not surprising, therefore, that the 400-hurdles finalist at this year's World Championships in Beijing immediately agreed when she was asked to become involved with a few young athletes with Down Syndrome who are preparing to compete at the SASA-II Open Games in Secunda.

This will be one of the last opportunities for these athletes to try to qualify for the World Championships for persons with Down Syndrome that will be presented in

Bloemfontein at the end of November. The Tuks/hpc athlete will help to improve the focus and coordination of these young athletes so that they will be better able to train and compete.

Judging by the reaction of Minette Swart (Pathways), Pieter Starke (Pathways) and Siphure Monama (Via Nova), Nel certainly

has the knack to relate to these athletes. Coincidentally, South Africa's National Down Syndrome day is also celebrated in October.

The athletes were smiling happily while Nel put them through exercises with two balls to help them improve their eye-hand and eve-foot coordination at the LC de Villiers-stadium.

To intensify their ability to focus, Nel had them do some fine motor activity exercises combined with balance.

To top it off, Nel surprised them with a challenge to run a 50 metres dash. As an extra incentive she lined up some gifts on the finishing line.

"With the 50 metre race I wanted the athletes to realise that you don't necessarily have to win to be considered a champion. Every time you participate in a race and run to the best of your ability you are a winner. That is why each athlete received a prize."

Asked why she decided to become involved with helping these athletes with Down Syndrome, Nel said that to be involved in sports is a real passion for her. "As far as I am concerned everybody, no matter who, deserves an opportunity to experience the joy of competing in sports. That is what I am planning to do when I

work with these athletes. I must admit that it is a mutual benefi-

cial relationship because they certainly also inspire me." Nel, who is qualified dietician, is working out some dietary guidelines for athletes who will be competing at the World Championships. Tessa van Heerden, marketing and communication manager of the SA Sports Association for the intellectually impaired, emphasised the importance of regular exercise for children with Down Syndrome.

Because most of them have a low muscle tone they need to move and be active to support their bodies.

"The more they move the more fluent their movements will become. Regular exer-

cise is also an intellectual stimulation and it helps the kids to learn better," Van Heerden explained.

Titans need to up their one-day game results

Halfway through the Momentum one-day series, the Titans are currently in a disappointing fourth place in the log, after mixed results in their games last week

Albie Morkel and his teammates could only win two games in the first phase of the competition. This tournament is now interrupted until the end of January 2016 and other cricket action will meanwhile take place.

There are, among other things, the local T20 series and the Ram Slam T20 Cricket Challenge, which begins this weekend.

The Titans' very good win by 7 wickets over the Dolphins last Wednesday, gave hope to their fans that they had eventually found their rhythm. The young Graeme van Buuren's 84 runs from 71 balls was a notable highlight and it reaffirmed the men from Centurion's depth.

Sunday in Kimberley, the Knights again uncovered the Titans as a team who does not like to bat first. Werner Coetsee, captain of the Knights, won the toss and sent the Titans to bat first. Only Heino Kuhn (55), who is once again in brilliant form, scored more than 50 runs.

Morkel's 40 off 29 balls at the end of the innings was also a good attempt to make the score look respectable.

The Knights, however, managed to bowl them all out in the 49th over for only 242 runs. This was never enough and there was great pressure on the Titans bowlers to try and defend this total.

Morkel used seven bowlers to perform the task, but ultimately it was impossible. However, they tried hard and, except for Junior Dala and Rowan Richards, all the bowlers managed to concede less than six runs per over.

Although the Knights' batsmen had to work hard for the victory, they could eventually pass the Titans' total in the 48th over.

As defending champions the Titans' fans obviously expect much more of them than the mediocre performance in the first half of this series. Therefore they will have to be much better when the tournament resumes at the end of January 2016.

Patience, persistence on road to 2016 Olympics

If Cornal Fredericks should line up in his starting blocks for the 400 hurdles final at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, it would be due to three words: patience, persistence and resilience.

The 2014 Commonwealth champion departed for England earlier this week to start training in all earnest for next year's Games.

This year was without a doubt an extremely frustrating one for the Tuks/hpc athlete. It all began when problems with his Achilles heel prevented him from training properly. Another frustration was uncertainty about who would coach him.

To cut to the chase, Fredericks had only a couple of opportunities to race during the entire season. His best performance was in Madrid during July where he finished fourth in 49.50s. This was good enough for him to qualify for the World Championships in Beijing but he did not compete in spite of being selected.

This was in sharp contrast to 2014 when Fredericks could seemingly do nothing wrong. In 13 races he only failed once to finish in the top three (finishing fourth) and was victorious on seven occasions. He won gold medals at the Commonwealth Games, the African Athletics Championships and the Continental Cup meeting. To top it all he finished third in the 400 hurdles Diamond League standings.

Fredericks admits he went slightly off the rails because of his severe frustration.

"There were times when I was still out and about in the early mornings. I wandered about aimlessly, not really caring about anything. In short I was really down and out. Luckily I have wonderful friends and family who really cared, especially my mom, Maureen. They made me realise I had unfinished business on the track and that it would be foolhardy of me just to let go of my dreams and goals."

There was much speculation why Fredericks did not compete at the Beijing World Championships. Some of the rumours were quite upsetting to him. "There is nothing more special to me than representing South Africa at a major championship. That is why it hurt when it was said I deliberately chose not to run in Beijing. Nothing could be further from the truth. As luck would have it, I picked up a small hamstring tear. It was nothing serious but given my experience with previous injuries I decided the risk of racing was just too great. I was certainly not able to run flat-out and I really did not want to end up having to do another three months of rehabilitation. That is why I withdrew from the World Championships."

Fredericks is excited about training in the UK under the guidance of Malcolm Arnold - national event coach for hurdles and a senior performance coach for UK athletics.

"Malcolm is a strict coach who does not hesitate to call a spade a spade," Fredericks said, "if he thinks it will help his athletes to



toe hy as eregas opgetree het. Hoewel Botha nie die tradisionele rol van gasspreker vervul het nie, het die gaste tog aan sy lippe gehang toe hy as hoogtepunt van die ontbyt saam met die bekende rugbykommentator, John van Rensburg, aan 'n vraag-en-antwoordsessie deelgeneem het.

Botha het die gehoor sommer vroeg verbaas toe hy sy weersin uitgespreek het in ouers wat te veel druk op hul kinders plaas om in sport te presteer.

Hy het tot vermaak van sy gehoor sy lewensverhaal opgesom as dié van 'n doodgewone voorstedelike seun wat nie té vroeg gedruk is om groot drome te droom nie.

Botha het vertel dat hy en sy jonger broer, soos baie Suid-Afrikaanse seuns, baie kompeterend was. Hyself het egter nooit groot drome van rugbyglorie gehad nie.

In sy voorlaaste jaar op skool het hy nog vir die tweede- en derdespan van HTS Middelburg gespeel en eers toe hulle na Vereeniging verhuis het, het Botha begin uitstaan en die eerstespan gehaal. Hy het vertel dat hy toé eers besef het dat hy werklik genoeg talent het om iets in rugby te bereik, nadat die Valke destyds aan hom 'n professionele kontrak aanbied het.

Botha het nie veel uitgebrei oor die eerste deel van sy loopbaan nie, maar wel gemaklik gesels oor sy tyd in Frankryk. Hier het hy sy gehoor gefassineer met sy eerlike gesprek oor sy liefde vir sy gesin en sy verantwoordelikheid as eggenoot en pa.
