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## Agricultural project for the north

Feasibility studies are being done into the establishment of an agricultural project aimed at sustainable small-scale farming and creating jobs in the northern corridor of Tshwane.

Last week, the Tshwane metro introduced its first multi-million rand Agropolitan Village, the Tshwane Food and Energy Centre (TFEC) in the far east of the metro.

"The City Sustainability Unit, a technical unit in the Office of the executive mayor, is currently in the process of doing feasibility studies into replicating the TFEC concept in the north of Tshwane," mayoral spokesman Blessing Manale said on Wednesday.

The sustainability unit had managed the establishment process of the Agropolitan Village in the east from design to implementation.

"It is a mayoral flagship project that will assist the city in its transition towards being a low carbon, resource efficient and climate resilient city," Manale said.

"Should the feasibility studies support the creation of such a village in the north, it would be able to produce and sell agricultural produce, generate its own renewable energy and provide jobs to the low income inhabitants living in under-utilised agricultural areas classified as highly socially vulnerable, such as Hammanskraal" he said.

The project introduced last week was a complete agricultural village located on a

200ha plot belonging to Tshwane.

Tshwane executive mayor Kgsosientso Ramokgopa said the design of the village aimed to achieve the multiple objectives of sustainable urban food production, renewable energy generation, SMME development, poverty reduction, employment creation, water use efficiency/optimisation, sustainable human settlements and local economic development.

The primary production at the TFEC consists of:

- 25 farms – each a Pty Ltd company;
- Combined chicken production from 60 000 chickens;
- Combined vegetable production from 7 200 m<sup>2</sup> of tunnels; and a
- Central farm to manage bulk-buying bulk-selling, quality and quantity control and synchronised production and sales.

The secondary production at the TFEC consists of a vegetable processing facility, seedling production, an abattoir and hatchery among others.

The mayor said that the risks of farming were well known and included high risks of failure due to climate, input and market vagaries and the inability to respond quickly enough as well as a lack of economies of scale resulting in unprofitable farming.

"Thus the approach to the agricultural village has been to mitigate these risks by establishing a central 'demonstration' farm that both serves as an active farm for livestock production, as well as a business support hub delivering agricultural exten-

sion services to 25 small-scale farmers.

"Each farmer had been supplied with vegetable tunnels and chicken coups and would manage these individually with the aim of becoming commercially viable.

"However, the benefits of economies of scale will be achieved through collective ownership of and access to an abattoir, hatchery, vegetable processing, seedling production, crop farming and feed mill

facilities," he said.

"This is not just a farming project – there are many different aspects to the project – and one can thus develop a whole range of skills that can be carried over into new ventures."

He said the TFEC had striven for self-sufficiency in both supplying the necessary infrastructure to make use of rainwater, groundwater and renewable energy.

Hy het naelskraap aan die dood ontkom.

Meer as 'n maand nadat hy uit die wrak gesny is, praat hy oor sy nagmerrie-ontervinding.

"Ek is gister weer uit die hospitaal ontslaan na ek 'n tweede keer opgeneem is."

Van den Berg onthou hoe hy op 22 Februarie op pad huis toe was, toe 'n boomtak op sy motor se dak en voorruit val.

"Dit was omstreeks 19:00 en ek was op pad huis toe in Gezina van Villieria af. 'n Tak van 'n boom langs die pad het afgebreek, en ek het so half in die vallende tak ingery," vertel hy.

Van den Berg onthou net die ongelooflike

pyn toe 'n deel van die tak wat sy voorruit gebreek het, hom in die sy deurboor het.

"Die reuse-boomtak het die motor se dak ingedruk en as ek nie na my linkerkant toe geleun het nie, het die dak my kop dalk ook beseer." Van den Berg sê daar was geen geluid of ander waarskuwing voor die tak op sy voertuig geval het nie.

"Ek het net die slag gehoor toe die tak my tref."

'n Motoris agter Van den Berg het ook skade gely. Die man het nooddienste na die toneel ontbied waar Van den Berg in sy voertuig vasgepen was.

"Ek kon nie asem kry nie. Die tak het op my bors gedruk en ek kon nie beweeg met die stuk wat deur my lyf gestek het nie."

Van den Berg sê nooddienste op die toneel het die voertuig soos 'n blik oopgesny om hom te bevry.

"Ek is na Montana private hospitaal gebring, waar ek vir agt dae in die waakeenhed was," sê hy. Van den Berg meen sy pad na herstel is 'n lang een.

"Ek het steeds pyn waarvoor ek sterk medikasie moet gebruik."

Van den Berg sê die boomtak is reeds vroeër deur inwoners as 'n gevaar uitgewys.

"'n Werknemer van die Tshwane-metro was blykbaar vroeër daar om takke van bome naby 'n kragkas af te sny," vertel hy.

"Maar die werker het glo volgens inwoners geweier om die einste tak af te sny wat oor die straat gehang het."

Van den Berg sê hy is in die proses om regstappe te doen en eis dat die metro soortgelyke gevare in woonbuurte verwyder om nog sulke ongelukke te voorkom.

"Dit gaan heel waarskynlik weke neem voor ek kan terugkeer werk toe.

"Die werwels in my nek is nog baie seer en dit maak dit moeilik om te bestuur."

Die metro het teen druktyd geen terugvoer verskaf nie.

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# Neglected parks are an eyesore and unsafe

A neglected, overgrown park and poor service delivery are irking residents in the north of Pretoria.

The park on Rivea Street, Doornpoort, was as recently as 2010 a source of pride in the spirit of the Soccer World Cup.

Now it is forgotten and being taken over by tall grass and waste not being thrown in dustbins.

DA councillor Arnold van Niekerk, who previously represented the ward, said the park was once the pride of Doornpoort 3.

"Irrigation systems were installed and as I believe, Ghana was one of the main donors who invested money to get this park ready for the World Cup."

A cast of a soccer ball and monument to the sporting event still graces the park which has now become home to criminals, according to residents.

"The crime rate increases in surrounding areas when there is a park or open field with tall grass which criminals can use as cover when they scout homes to rob," said Hannes Coetzee, current councillor for ward 96.

Coetzee arranged a meeting for Doornpoort residents last week to discuss their concerns.

Neglected parks and service delivery in the area and dysfunctional streetlights topped the list of concerns.

Coetzee said some of the streetlights had been out of order for the past five months.

"Community policing forums (CPF) report a lot more house robberies and burglaries in these areas as opposed to residential areas that are well-lit."

Coetzee said neglected parks and open areas also provided shelter to evildoers.

"This park is supposed to be used for recreation and playground for our children, but even adults are afraid to cross the park for fear of being ambushed by criminals hiding in the tall grass."

Coetzee sent a letter to the Tshwane metro listing his concerns.

"All we ask of the metro is that it maintains our public parks and repairs the streetlights we have reported as dysfunctional," a Doornpoort resident told *Rekord* during a meeting at the park last week.

The Tshwane metro is yet to respond to a request for comment.

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## Police warn against scam

Police have warned about a scam doing the rounds after a case was reported in Rosebank, Johannesburg in January.

Other incidents have been reported in Western Cape, KwaZulu-Natal, Limpopo and the Free State.

People were urged to rather report receipt of such an SMS to the police instead of responding to it.

het, hulle makgemaak het en teen 'n klein fooi ritte aan kinders gebied het.

Hy het maandeliks tussen R600 en R800 verdien wat hy meesal gebruik het om sy diere te versorg.

Kinderhuise het gratis perdrifte ontvang.

In 2005 het hy genoeg geld gespaar om 'n klein huisie in Wolmer te huur.

Vos moes sy perde opgee maar het toe sy eie "kwekery" uit sy huur-tuin begin. Hy het lank 'n bestaan gemaak deur aarbeie, blomkool en eksotiese blomme aan inwoners in die noorde te verkoop.

"Om te bedel vir geld en klere is iets wat ek nog nooit gedoen het of sal doen nie," sê hy.

"'n Mens moet werk om te bestaan," sê Vos.

In 2007 het Vos saam met ander inwoners in Wolmer betoeg toe die stadsraad geëis het sowat 200 huureenhede opgegee moes word aan nuwe eienaars om swart ekonomiese bemagtiging te bevorder.

Met die hulp van AfriForum, die burgerregte-inisiatief van Solidariteit, was die optog 'n sukses en kon die huurders hul wonings behou.

"Ek en my vrou, Linda ontvang staatspensioen en ons het by die departement van behuising vir 'n munisipale huis in Wolmer aansoek gedoen."

Vos en sy vrou sou op 20 April by hul by eerste permanente woning intrek.

# Victim recovers after being shot

The Pretoria North man shot and wounded in a robbery last week says he is recovering well from his injury.

"I refused to give them my laptop and money and a fight ensued.

"I was shot in the back," he told *Rekord* last week from his hospital bed.

He asked to remain anonymous.

The robbery took place outside his house in Leon Street, Tileba, north of Pretoria.

"I was just on my way from the bank when I parked my car in front of the gate.

"As I was taking out my laptop bag, a strange vehicle with three occupants approached me," he said.

"Two men got out and one pointed a firearm at me.

"He instructed me to give him money and my

laptop."

He resisted and was shot in the process.

"The three men eventually took my money and laptop before fleeing the scene," the man said.

Family members heard the shots and rushed to his aid.

The man was taken to hospital where he spent four days in the intensive care unit.

"I got out of hospital on Friday, but I'm still recovering and taking medication for the pain in my back," the man told *Rekord* on Wednesday morning.

Miraculously the bullet had missed his vital organs.

"I'll be returning to the hospital on 24 May for a checkup, but I'm doing much better now."

Pretoria North police spokesperson Lieutenant Rebecca Phathane previously said the three robbers were still on the run.

No arrests have yet been made.

# Gang member arrested for kidnapping

The man linked to a kidnapping syndicate was expected to appear in Polokwane Magistrate's Court on Thursday. He was recently arrested in Wonderpark, Pretoria North after a Limpopo woman was kidnapped outside her uncle's house last month.

Anisah Moosa (35) was grabbed in Nirvana by three armed men on

15 March. They forced her into the back seat of her silver Audi and drove off. The family then received ransom demands.

Hawks spokesperson Brigadier Hangwani Mulaudzi said one of the kidnapers was arrested in Wonderpark last Thursday.

Various police units investigated the case and Moosa was safely returned home three days later.

According to the Moosa family spokesperson, Yusuf Abramjee, three police officers were shot and injured before Anisha was freed.

"We thank the Hawks and police for working around the clock. Let us now allow the law to take its course. We remain confident that the remaining gang members will be arrested," and added that Moosa was doing well.

Sarie, gebore as 'n Fourie, sê sy het in Vryburg in Noordwes op 'n plaas grootgeword. Steve is in Brits gebore en getoë.

“Soos die Here dit wou hê, het beide van ons in Boksburg skoolgegaan waar ons later sou ontmoet,” vertel Sarie.

Steve was in die weermag. In die Tweede Wêreldoorlog was hy in beheer van die vervoer en versending van troepe na Italië en Egipte.

trou’,” vertel Sarie met 'n vonkel in haar oë as sy na Steve kyk.

Sy sê daar was dadelik 'n vonk tussen hulle. “Ons het net 'n aanvoeling vir mekaar gehad. Ons het 'n maand na ons ontmoeting op 22 Maart verloof geraak en is op 18 April getroud.”

Die paartjie was gesêem met twee kinders en spog nou met ses kleinkinders, sewe agterkleinkinders en een agter-agter-kleinkind.

Saam met die goeie jare, sê Sarie, het hulle mekaar ook bygestaan in moeiliker tye. “Ons het ons seun jare gelede verloor. Dit was maar 'n harde slag vir albei van ons.”

Sy sê met Steve aan haar sy kan sy steeds bly opstaan en voortgaan al raak die waters soms diep.

“Dit is vir my verskriklik moeilik sonder hom,” sê sy en Steve druk haar stywer vas teen sy sy.

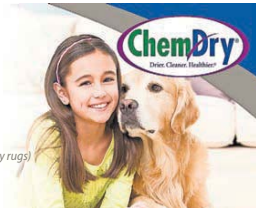

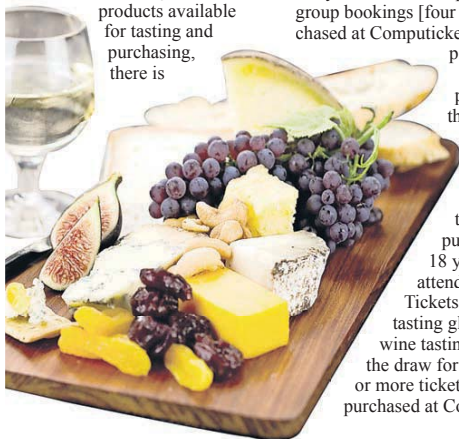

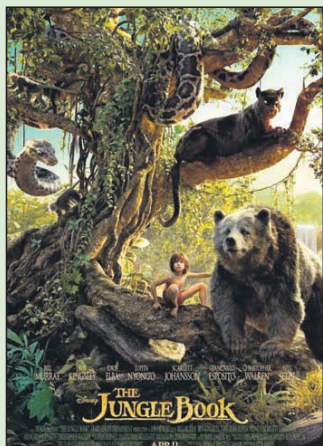

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# Saving on buying cost

Buying a home directly from the developer suits first-time buyers and others without cash for transfer duties and other transaction costs.

But there are some important details to keep in mind, says Shaun Rademeyer, CEO of BetterLife Home Loans.

One of the most appealing aspects of buying an off-plan or newly-built home is that

tax is built into the sales price, in the form of VAT.

“For anyone buying a property priced at more than R750 000 this means a considerable saving.

“When it comes to up-front expenses, there is no transfer duty payable,” Rademeyer says.

There may be savings even for those buying lower-priced homes, because developers will often cover bond registration costs and transfer legal fees as a purchase incentive.

In new developments it is often a case of *the price you see is the price you pay*.

Further benefits include moving into a new home and a planned community that most likely offers excellent security measures and communal amenities.

“On top of that, off-plan buyers are often able to customise the layout and finishes of their new homes to suit their personal preferences.”

However, buying off plan does present some hurdles. In most cases buyers have to base their decisions on two-dimensional visual materials such as building plans and architects’ drawings, as opposed to actually seeing the physical home that is on offer.

“In addition, off-plan buyers must make sure they sign two sales agreements – one for the purchase of the land, and a second for the

purchase of the home that is to be built on that land, so that payments to the builder or developer can be linked to building progress and completion,” he says.

“Indeed, the building contract in any off-plan purchase should contain details of every item and specification agreed to with the builder or developer – including price, floor plan, wiring, plumbing, fixtures, fittings and even paint specifications, as well as a completion date.”



# Property market trends

It is no secret that the current economic climate is tough and interest rates are predicted to continue climbing.

Higher interest rates inevitably impact on every sector in the economy, including the property sector, but what exactly are the real effects on a flourishing area such as Pretoria East for instance and how can buyers and sellers equip themselves under the current circumstances to make the best decisions possible?

Gerhard van der Linde, Seeff’s managing director in Pretoria East, says despite the unfavourable market conditions, all areas in the east of Pretoria remain sought-after.

“Although all price classes enjoy some degree of demand, the most popular price range is for property priced below R2.5 million in Garsfontein, Faerie Glen, Moreletta Park and Equestria.”

He says homes in security complexes and higher density homes, especially the Menlyn area, are selling fast.

Despite constant sales, financial institutions and their strict lending criteria still remain one of the biggest hurdles.

Most banks have a very conservative approach to financing and find more reasons not to lend money than the reverse. Around 40% of applications are rejected.

On a positive note, a new development such as Menlyn Maine has a very favourable impact on the adjacent areas and is regarded as Pretoria’s own Sandton.

Stock levels in the area have dropped by about 20% since last year, due to the stagnant economy.

The most important reason for this is that many sellers have decided to hold on to what they have as opposed to upgrading. As a result sales volumes have also declined by around 5%.

Van der Linde says sellers need to be especially mindful that prices are under pressure and the time for unreasonable price expectations are over.

When a seller attaches unrealistic price tags to a property, it stays on the market an average of 145 days.

When realistically priced, it can often be sold within 30 days. It does not mean that the property is priced too low, but rather that buyers recognised its value after comparing it to similar properties in the area.

Seeff Pretoria East sells 92% of properties on its portfolio at asking price, so it is vital that properties are correctly priced from the get-go.

Prices in the east have grown by 9.67% compared to last year.

# Be selective about advice when selling

When it comes to selling a home there is no shortage of advice from a number of sources, such as family and friends.

However, being given a lot of information does not necessarily mean it is the right information.

Adrian Goslett, regional director and CEO of RE/MAX of Southern Africa, says receiving advice from so many different sources could lead to uncertainty.

In today's age of technology there is a vast amount of information at consumer's fingertips, but determining what can be trusted is a different matter.

"It is not always easy to determine what information and advice should be held onto and what to ignore. As a result there are several misconceptions that have made their way into the marketplace," says Goslett.

He provides a few truths and facts to debunk some misconceptions:

- Misconception that sellers determine the home's selling price.

While sellers will have a say in setting the asking price, the selling price of the property is largely based on the market.

It is important that the asking price of the home is what is considered to be a fair market value based on key elements such as the home's size, condition, location, the current property market conditions and the selling prices of comparable homes in the area.

"It is ultimately the seller who will have the final say as to what the home is listed for, but it is important to note that the initial asking price and the actual selling price of the property could be vastly different."

- Misconception that pricing the home above market value will leave negotiation

room:

Overpricing a home does two things – it chases potential buyers away and makes other homes in the area look like a bargain.

Sellers may feel that they are giving themselves some cushioning during the negotiating process, but in actual fact overpricing has the opposite effect.

It turns buyers away and the deal never gets to the negotiation stage.

If buyers have done their homework and researched home prices in the area, they will recognise an overinflated asking price and will likely bypass taking a second look at the property.

Goslett says there might be buyers who can afford to purchase the property for its fair market value, but overlook the property if it is listed for too much.

# No record for playful Shange

Lebogang Shange could have set a new SA 20km race walk record at the African Senior Athletics Championship in Stellenbosch the past weekend if he did not 'fool around' so much during the early stages of the race. The Tuks/hpc race walker won in a time of 1 hour 20 minutes and 42 seconds, which is just 36 seconds slower than the record he set in Adelaide, Australia, earlier this year. Wayne Snyman was second in 1:20:46 and Sizwe Ndebele third in 1:28:58.

The times set by both Shange and Snyman are the fastest in the history of race walking at a South African Championships. Both of them again qualified for the Olympic Games in Rio. Shange and his coach, Chris Britz, are the first to admit that they did not plan for him to walk at such a fast pace. In fact, Britz's advice to Shange at the start was to win in the slowest possible time and that was exactly what the SA record holder (1:20:06) intended to do. Unfortunately Snyman had a different race strategy.

He set off at a brisk pace right from the start and was soon in the lead while Shange was fooling around, worrying about his sunglasses and chatting away with his fans on route. When Shange realised that Snyman was not going to slow down, he set out to catch up with him, which he did at about the 10km marker. Then, somewhat surprisingly, Shange seemed to slow down again before catching up with Snyman for a second time. During the next few kilometres the two of them were involved in a titanic struggle with Shange eventually taking the lead with 1.5km to go.

Britz afterwards commented that Shange could possibly have become the first South African to set a time faster than 1 hour and 20 minutes if he had raced aggressively right from the start. "The reason why I told Lebogang to take it easy was because he had raced at an IAAF Race Walking Challenge event in Portugal the previous weekend and I was not sure whether he had fully recovered," said Britz.

The South African champion is quite philosophical about missing out on breaking 80 minutes on Saturday. "It is still early in the season so at the moment there is no need for me to go for a really fast time. I fully agree with my coach that it is important for me to pace myself in the build-up to the Olympic Games in Rio. It would be wrong for me to do too much too early in the season and then lose when it really matters at the Games."

# Our local rowers in top form

South Africa's top rowers made their mark the past weekend in the finals of the World Cup Rowing Regatta in Varese, Italy.

They walked away with two gold medals and two bronze ones.

In what should be no surprise, the stalwarts of South African rowing, James Thompson and John Smith from the Tuks high performance centre (hpc) won the gold medal in the men's lightweight double sculls final.

The decision made by Roger Barrow, national rowing coach based at the Tuks/hpc, to change the women's pair crew paid dividends.

Kate Christowitz and Lee-Ann Persse were victorious in the women's final.

Kirsten McCann and Ursula Grobler, who won the bronze medal at last year's World Championships, were third in the women's lightweight double sculls final.

Lawrence Brittain and Shaun Keeling won a bronze medal in the men's pair final.

Coming into the final sprint of the men's lightweight double sculls final Thompson and Smith had a slight lead, with both Ireland and the Netherlands within striking distance of the leading crew.

When Ireland upped their stroke rate, so

did South Africa. These two crews crossed the line almost together with the South Africans doing just enough to ensure the victory.

Thompson is quite realistic about their victory.

“It is always good to be in a leading position at the beginning of the season even though not all the big crews are here,” he said.

“We're very pleased with the way we started this season but the fact that we have learned a lot during these past three days of racing is even more important.”

Now it was back to the grindstone, smiled Thompson.

In the women's pair final Italy's Alessandra Patelli and Sara Bertolasi had a slight lead at the start, but Persse and Christowitz did some catching up.

The Italians continued to challenge the South Africans until the end of the race, but could not overtake them.

South Africa crossed the line first, with an elated Patelli and Bertolasi finishing second.

“So far so good for our season, but we still have a long way to go if we stay in the same combination.

“From now on we take every day as it comes,” said Christowitz.

The men's pair final turned out to be

a tough challenge between the crews of Britain, the Dutch and South Africa.

The Brits won, the Dutch were second and South Africa came third.

Roel Braas and Mitchel Steenman, who finished fourth at last year's World Rowing Championships, got away the quickest.

But Great Britain's Matthew Tarrant and Nathaniel Reilly-O'Donnell did a push that took them into the lead and they kept up the effort to stay ahead.

When the final 500m came into view, the Brits simply refused to let their lead slip and they won in 6:40:06, with the Dutch second and South Africa third.

## Golfer keeps up with studies

Being South Africa's top senior amateur golf player is not always only about sinking the crucial puts.

Over the weekend, 18-year-old Marco Steyn was part of the junior squad who celebrated an 18th consecutive victory for South Africa in the 2016 All-Africa Junior Golf Challenge in Tunisia.

Barely 48 hours later, back in South Africa, Steyn was trying to understand the intricacies of maths. It was 19:00 but for him it is not uncommon to study at odd hours.

When he is not playing golf, he usually attends extra maths and science classes during weekends. According to the grade 12 pupil from TuksSport High School, he always takes his textbooks with him when playing a tournament. Having completed his round he takes time out to study.

“Playing good golf and getting good marks in my matric exams are equally important,” said Steyn.

The fact that Steyn is currently SA's top amateur golf player should be no surprise.

During a meeting with the coaches of the Tuks Golf Academy last year he set himself two goals.

One was to become number one in South Africa and the second was to qualify for the South African team to play at the World Championships in Mexico in August. He has already achieved the first of his goals.

Steyn ascribes his rise to the top to the fact that he consistently plays good golf.

So far this year he won the Free State Open; lost in the semi-finals of the SA Amateur Match Play; was third in the Northern Amateur Stroke Play; third in the Northern Amateur Match Play and tied fourth in the Cape Province Open.

He also won the Leopard Creek Trophy, which is the only local u.19 tournament he

has played so far. Steyn does not hesitate to credit the coaches of Tuks Golf Academy for his success.

“My mom met up with Llewellyn van Leeuwen, the Academy's head coach, and introduced me to him when I was just five years old.

“In grade 9, when I went to the TuksSport High School, I was playing from a three handicap. Because of the advice I received from the academy's coaches, it did not take me long to improve on that.

“One of the most important lessons I have learned from Theo Bezuidenhout, sports psychologist, is not to get angry when you play a bad shot.”

## Abundant titles for locals

Local athletes in the colours of Gauteng North dominated the weekend's senior athletics championships and brought home several titles.

Henricho Bruintjies produced a stunning upset on Friday night to close day one of the ASA Senior Championships in style at Coetzenburg stadium in Stellenbosch.

Bruintjies clocked 10.17 seconds to win the national men's 100m title, 0.04

ahead of training partner and SA record holder, Akani Simbine, who appeared to be limping after the race.

“The only thing I wanted was to come here and take the title,” Bruintjies said.

“I have not been on the podium for a while, and for me the time was not important. It is all about the title. My target is to make the title mine when I defend it next year,” he concluded.

Former World Championships bronze medallist, LJ van Zyl proved he was still a force in the men's 400m hurdles, drawing clear of former training partner Cornel Fredericks down the home straight to secure victory in 49.34.

It was the 100th time in his career that Van Zyl had dipped under 49.50, as he

bagged his eighth national title.

“It is my 14th SA Senior Championships and I still love the sport a lot,” Van Zyl said. “It has been a fantastic day of athletics.”

Fredericks, returning home from his base in England, took second place in 49.75. Six athletes from Gauteng North took part in the final in this item. (See video)

In the women's 400m hurdles final,

Wenda Nel clocked an impressive 54.84 in her first race of the season over her specialist distance, winning gold more than four seconds ahead of silver medallist Anneri Moolman.

“I really hoped for a sub-55 but I did not want to put pressure on myself,” Nel

said. “It is my first race, so I just wanted to break the ice, but I'm very happy with my achievement.”

Defending champion Stephen Mokoka won a tactical men's 5 000m race after closing the gap on early leader Elroy Gelant and winning a sprint finish in 13:40.81.

After starting quickly in the women's 5 000m final, Irvette van Zyl struggled with a stomach bug, and though she slowed in the second half, set a personal best of 16:02.63 to earn the gold medal.

# Tuks are 2016 Young Guns champs

Tuks outmuscled the University of Johannesburg (UJ) 47-24 at UJ stadium to win the Varsity Cup Young Guns final last week.

Conditions were perfect on Tuesday in Johannesburg, as Tuks met UJ for the 2016 Young Guns Final.

UJ soon equalised with a try of their own in the 11th minute, by number eight, Morney Moos. The score was 8-8 going into the 20th minute strategy break.

## African champs silver can put Piontek on road to Rio

Zack Piontek (Tuks/hpc) might be on his way to the Olympic Games in Rio after he won a silver medal at the African Championship in Tunis, Tunisia.

Before the championships, Piontek was ranked 24th in the u.90kg category. His international ranking will certainly be higher on the rankings that will be released later this week.

Piontek is slightly disappointed that he was not able to win the gold medal in Tunisia. It was the second time in two years that he lost in the final of the African Championships.

"Winning the title was a major goal for 2016, but I have no excuses. I gave it my best, but the better man won.

"Our category actually played out exactly according to the way we were ranked. I was ranked second and lost in the final to Abderra Benamadi from Algeria who was ranked number one," said the 2014 Commonwealth Champion.

"The positive I can take from my performance is that it most likely gave

me enough international ranking points to compete in Rio. But I will only know for certain on 31 May."

Piontek described his semi-final fight against Egypt's Hatem Abd El Akher as a tough encounter.

"Abd El Akher won the African title in 2013 and 2014. Unfortunately for him he was side-lined by an injury and was only able to start competing again at the end of last year.

I have to be honest. Beating Abd El Akher was special because the last time we fought was in 2013 and he won. It was payback time for me" he said.

"Benamadi beat me in the final because he was able to counter most of my attacks. There was a moment when I thought I might win."
