1936 MERCEDES BENZ 540K SPECIAL ROADSTER REPLICA

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Succeeding the SS/SSK of the 1920s and the eight-cylinder 500K of the early 1930s, the 540K debuted in October 1936. With more than 180 hp available with their Ferdinand Porsche-designed supercharger, the 540K (K=Kompressor or supercharger) continues to rank high among the world's finest automobiles ever conceived. While the top custom coachbuilders applied their prowess to the 540K chassis, the factory coachworks at Sindelfingen had already earned a reputation for design excellence and uncompromising workmanship – perhaps the best in Europe. To many aficionados, the range of cars produced by Bentley and Rolls Royce through the 1950s and 1960s marked the end of an era in traditional luxury motorcar manufacture for which the margues were made famous. The separate chassis allowed in-house designers to pen the most elegant of designs, while outside coachbuilders such as H.J. Mulliner, Park Ward, and James Young were able to demonstrate their own interpretations of luxury and sporting style.

Launched in 1962, the Bentley S3 and its Rolls Royce Silver Cloud III equivalent employed the 6.2-liter aluminum-alloy V-8 engine introduced on the S2/Cloud II - though with larger carburetors, a new distributor, and increased compression ratio. The excellent four-speed GM-derived automatic transmission was standard equipment. Most obvious among many changes from the preceding models were the adoption of four-headlamp lighting, the absence

of sidelights from the wing tops, and a 1 4-inch lower radiat hood line. Inside there was improved accommodation with s room for rear passengers.

The heady performance of the 365 GT 2+2 was matched by luxurious interior appointments including plush leather upholstery, richly veneered wooden trim panels, the last wood-rimmed steering wheel to grace a production Ferrari model, and standard power-operated window lifts. By the time production ended in 1970, Ferrari had built just 801 examples of the 365 GT 2+2. While small in number, the 365 GT 2+2 was a great commercial success, accounting for about half of total Ferrari production during its brief three-year run. It was also the last luxury-oriented, 12-cylinder Ferrari until the debut of the 456 GT in 1992.



The Mk VI Bentleys all have coil-spring independent front suspensions with a rubber-bushed lower wishbone, an anti-roll bar, and lever-arm hydraulic dampers. 
1963 JAGUAR XKE ROADSTER

The establishment Abarth & C. SrL in March 1949 marks the genesis of one of the world's greatest racing dynasties. He rebuilt the motor, significantly the original unit that was in the car with the Abarth crank stamped "11 - 59 Mille Miglia" and the cylinder-head bolts stamped "Abarth."

The fourth owner and consignor, also of New Mexico, acquired the Zagato in 2012 and returned it to running order. Other work included installation of new brake lines, wheel cylinders, and brake master. He checked all

numbers on the trim pieces and installed new rubber seals on the door and side glass. The interior received new wool carpeting, reinstalled rear panels, and a new headliner made to replicate the original item. All chrome is original to the car, including that of the bumpers, window surrounds, and door pulls. All gauges were checked by MOMA.
