Sebeeha triumphs against the odds

Twelve-year-old Sebeeha Khan (pictured) is on a mission to raise awareness among her peers about a condition called Kidney Urinary Tract Infection (KUTI) infection also known as reflux in the kidney's, which she has been living with for the last two years. The bright and articulate grade 7 pupil from Wembley Primary pupil was diagnosed with KUTI after being misdiagnosed by three other doctors who did not pick up on the symptoms that she was experiencing. Her mother, Zeenat Khan said, "Two years ago, Sebeeha was passing urine with drops of blood. We took her to a doctor who thought it was a kidney infection and she was given a course of antibiotics, but then it came back. After the third course of antibiotics, we went to another

doctor who picked up that something else was wrong and she was taken for tests." The concerned parents were referred to a specialist in Mt Edgecombe who diagnosed her correctly. Once Sebeeha started her treatment, the Khan's met many other parents with children who also have this problem and they were surprised by how common it is, and how easily the signs can be missed. "This is issue is more common than people think. If left untreated, it could become more serious for the child," added Mrs Khan. Sebeeha now has her condition under control and with the permission of her school principal and parents, this brave young lady took the decision to talk to her school peers about her condition. She said, "I want to make the other children aware about

this because I don't want other children to suffer. This disease has not stopped me in any way and I still plan to achieve my own dreams." Sebeeha plans to become a chartered accountant some day and sees no reason why this disease should be an obstacle to her bright future. Despite the extreme challenges she has faced at such an early age, Sebeeha has maintained good academic scores at school, which she feels is important. Due to her age and because she is still growing, her doctors do not plan to take the risk of an operation at this stage, as the condition has been known to repair itself with the correct treatment and time in young patients. Some of the symptoms for parents to look out for is:

- High fevers over 38 degrees Celsius
 - Bad smelling urine or burning sensation when using the toilet.
 - Young children and infants have been known to have trouble eating and don't gain weight
 - Vomiting and diarrhoea
 - Older children complain of lower back pain or pain in the abdomen
 - Symptoms are often accompanied by constipation
- Children presenting these symptoms should be tested for KUTI.

Search for missing man intensifies

The family of missing man, Povendran (Ashley) Kistasamy are growing increasingly concerned after he went missing on Saturday at 3pm from Umhlanga. The 34-year-old Southgate resident was last seen at 3pm in the Umhlanga area, wearing a Fish Away manager shirt and uniform pants. He drives an Almera 1.6 2002 deep blue Sedan.

His sister, Geraldine Kistasamy said that her brother was with her on Saturday morning and she was expecting him to come back to see her at 4pm. She said, "Ashley and I were together that morning as he was helping me with something and we made plans to see each other later that day at 4pm. I spoke to him later that day and he said that he was busy with a client, I thought that he would come back later at about 9pm, which is the time he sometimes comes home. At 11pm, my mother woke me to say that he had still not returned. We called his mobile and it has been going to voicemail ever since." According to the family, the police have begun a search in the Durban north and central Durban area. There have been some sightings of the car, but nothing has been confirmed as yet. His siblings describe Ashley as a quiet man who is very responsible and they don't believe that this is something that he would voluntarily do. The family are calling

Phoenix man killed in car dispute

Another Phoenix man was fatally shot in the early hours of Sunday morning, after a car deal turned sour and an argument broke out between two men in Acara Street, Stonebridge. Govindsamy Moonsamy was shot and killed at the scene while, Sugan Pillay sustained a gunshot to the shoulder and another man was said to be injured when shots were allegedly fired from the crowd during the argument.

According to SAPS communications officer, Lt Louise Naidoo, the two men involved in the dispute were believed to be arguing over the payment of the car when shots were fired from the crowd. She said, "It has been

reported that the shots were fired at the men, from the crowd. It is believed that the shooter is connected to one of the men and it is currently being investigated. Two men have been arrested in connection with the shooting and appeared in court on Tuesday morning." Local security firm KZN VIP were called to the scene of the incident and reported on their webpage that witnesses are claiming that the argument was allegedly over R2500, which was allegedly owed for the payment of a car. The exact circumstances around the shooting are still under investigation with the SAPS.

Public urged to be aware at ATMs

Phoenix residents are urged to be extra vigilant at ATMs after security officers apprehend a suspect involved in an ATM theft at Acropolis Mall in Parthenon Street.

The complainant and his wife were at the ATM drawing cash from the machine when suddenly, a man pulled out his card from the machine and ran away. The victim chased the man, who jumped into a silver VW and sped off. The unfolding events were witnessed by security officers who chased after the suspects in a

private vehicle. The suspect's vehicle stopped and two of the suspects fled in opposite directions. The bank card was recovered at the scene. The card owner was able to get his card back and no money had been taken from his account. A 19-year-

old suspect was apprehended in connection to the crime and appeared in court recently. Phoenix SAPS are thankful to the security officers for their quick reaction at the scene of the incident.

R3m truck stolen in business robbery

The spate of business robberies in Mt Edgecombe continues to rise as a local business truck worth R3million was high-jacked on Wednesday at 10pm. The truck was routinely entering the business premises that evening and the gate was opened by the security officer.

The death of a well respected architect, Ram (Sharmy) Dipchun, from Unit 13 is still shrouded in mystery after he went missing on February 8 and his allegedly naked body was later washed up on the shore of a beach in Durban North.

The last person/s to see the deceased have never come forward despite repeated requests for witnesses to account for the whereabouts of Dipchun on the day he went missing. When the family did not hear from him, it was reported to SAPS and posts were placed on social media

by Durban North SAPS. Communications officer, Robert Deokoran said, "We are investigating the drowning of Mr Dipchun, but we have limited information at present. We can confirm that there was a sighting of him getting into an unknown car on the day, but nobody has come forward and we really need witnesses to contact us with any information that they have. We cannot confirm whether we suspect foul play at this point as we are currently waiting on the post mortem to be completed." Residents oppose new housing development

The unexpected housing development taking place off Longcroft Drive has caused an uproar among residents. Protests were recently held to contest the proposed new development which, according to the residents, are being done without any consultation of the local community. An emergency meeting was held on Saturday by the community leaders and residents, to set up a committee with the sole task of addressing these kinds of issues within the community. The end of the meeting resulted in the formation of the new committee called, Voice of Phoenix (VOP). Residents from the surrounding area that are directly affected by the development met at the Cornerstone Church off Longbury Drive to discuss their concerns about the project. The discussion was led by Rakesh Sughream, who explained why the committee is being formed. Other community leaders such as CPF Chairman Glen Naidoo were also in attendance to address the concerns that were being raised by the residents and to discuss the best way forward. According to official reports, the land near Longcroft is going to be used to provide low cost housing for the poor in the area. However, rumours have been circulating that this is not the case and that the plot is privately owned and the plans are actually intended for the building of a multi million rand private estate. One concerned resident said, "Some of the residents approached the contractors about their plans for low cost homes and asked to be put on a waiting list to purchase a home and we

were refused because apparently, even though not one building has been built, they have all been sold. How is that possible? I think that this is just another ploy by the rich to push the poor aside in their quest for more money." Newly elected member of VOP, Trevor Moodley, expressed his concerns in the meeting over effect that these new buildings will have on other homes nearby. He said, "I am concerned about the actual infrastructure and waste disposal facilities in these new homes. Is the ground being used safe enough and are they doing the correct layout to provide the utilities for the new houses, that won't affect the other residents? We need these points to be clarified." Five residents were independently selected and voted in to create the new community group. Cllr Saroj Govender was at the meeting and offered her support to the residents in the fight against this issue. Ward Cllr Tino Pillay who assisted in the arrangement of the meeting said, "Everything was done above board. This is a non-political affiliated group that has the sole responsibility of tackling these kinds of issues in the community and getting answers."

Two arrested in firearms bust

Two men were arrested by Inanda Crime Prevention Unit members recently after they were found in possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition.

In the first incident, police officers were conducting their regular patrols in the area when they stopped a Toyota Corolla. Two occupants were inside. The vehicle was searched and a 9mm pistol with seven live rounds of ammunition was seized.

A 26-year-old suspect was apprehended. Following this, cops continued with the patrol and spotted another vehicle. A 37-year-old man was found in possession of an unlicensed firearm with 40 live rounds of ammunition.

The other three firearms with 15 live rounds were found abandoned in Amaoti. Both suspects

appeared in court. "All firearms will be subjected to ballistic testing to establish if they have been used to commit crimes in the country," said the province's commissioner, Lt Gen Mmamonye Ngobeni.

Swift action leads to arrest

The swift reaction from a concerned neighbour led to the arrest of a copper theft suspect, while he was trying to steal from a property. On February 8, at 10.15am, a resident on Sicklewood place heard strange noises coming from her neighbour's yard. She went to investigate and noticed an unknown man throwing out tap fittings and copper pieces out of the window. The concerned neighbour immediately called on other neighbours for assistance, who immediately called SAPS to the scene. The 18-year-old suspect was apprehended while trying to flee the scene. The suspect was arrested and charged for housebreaking. Phoenix Station Commander, Br DB Ndlovu said, "We applaud the Sicklewood

community for working together with the police and for looking out for each other. What this neighbour did demonstrates how positive it can be for a community when neighbours look after everyone's interest.

In another incident, another home owner left his property on Sunday morning and was alarmed to receive a call from a neighbour to say that his home had been broken into. When the complainant got home, he discovered that valuable items had been stolen from his home. Later on that same day, the complainant received word that a 45-year-old local man was seen with some of the stolen goods. The suspect was arrested and charged and appeared in court recently.

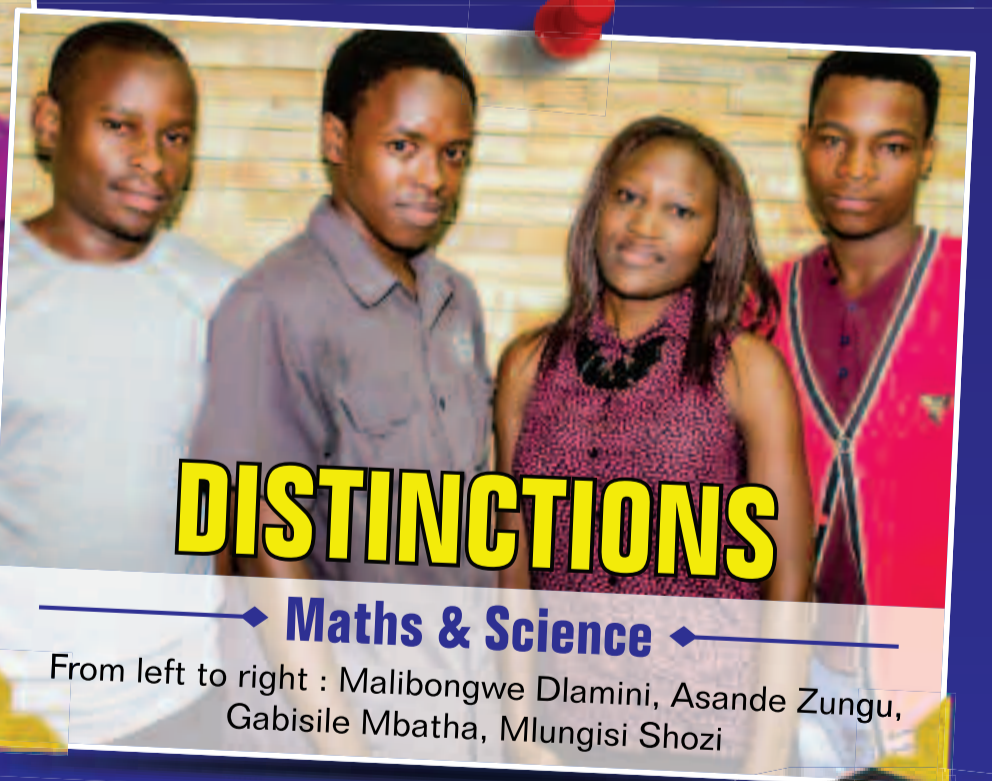

Risk of HIV/Aids remains alarmingly high among SA teens

The start of the new school year usually bristles with anticipation among pupils, but despite the excitement, the startling reality is that more than 2, 300 girls between the ages of 15 and 24 will contract HIV every single week.

Research shows that the incidence of new HIV infections among young females is more than four times higher than that of their male counterparts. With over 400, 000 new HIV infections a year, South Africa still ranks first in HIV incidence in the world.

Public health specialist at Careworks, an HIV management organisation, Marina Rifkin, said the risk is particularly great for high school pupils because they are more likely to engage in risky sexual behaviour, such as unprotected sex, since they are not necessarily skilled in negotiating condom use with their partners.

"Sexually active young women are particularly vulnerable as they often engage in sexual relationships with older men. Research conducted by the Centre for the AIDS Programme Research in SA (Caprisa) shows a trend of girls contracting HIV from older men. The study found that both girls and boys on completion of grade 7 remained HIV-negative. However, by the time they finished grade 12, about 7-10 percent of girls were HIV-positive, yet most of the boys remained HIV-negative. This is because the girls were having intercourse with older men who were likely to already have been infected by the HIV virus," explained Rifkin.

She further pointed out that sexual debut for many of the country's youth is often much younger than 16 – the legal age of consensual sex. She added that many will have had their first sexual experience by the age of 14 or

even younger.

To date, voluntary HIV counselling and testing, promoting delay of sexual debut and correct and consistent condom use when engaging in intercourse have shown some success among the youth, but she says other prevention interventions such as voluntary medical male circumcision (VMMC) is crucial and shouldn't be discounted.

Currently, over 2 million men in SA aged 15 to 49 have been circumcised. South Africa is about halfway toward the national target of circumcising 4.3 million males aged 15 to 49 by December 2016.

"The once-off 20 minute procedure reduces a man's lifetime risk of HIV by up to 60 percent and it helps to prevent other STIs. VMMC also reduces the



risk of penile cancer, and reduces the risk of acquiring the human papilloma virus (HPV) and, as a result, cervical cancer among the female partners of circumcised males," she explained.

Ongoing research in Orange Farm, South Africa, has shown lower HIV infection rates among circumcised men than among uncircumcised men. Models also suggest that VMMC scale-up would reduce HIV incidence in Eastern and Southern Africa by roughly 30-50 percent over 10 years.

"The take home message is that the risk reduction offered by circumcision is substantial and could reduce the immediate and long term risk for both young men and women. Young people also need help in preventing HIV and parents can play an important role in the prevention process," she concluded.

They help these individuals to safe keep their medication and report every day on fixed time so that they can complete the treatment according to the required schedule.

The organisation is urging business houses to come forward and assist them. The community has been a huge support to them and the organisation appreciates all efforts made. The organisation requires non-perishable food items, office equipment and donations to pay their workers who have been volunteering during this time.

BMW 7 Series

Seventh heaven

The BMW 7 Series and me go back a bit (I think it's grammatically correct to say "and I" but what I just wrote sounds better, less narcissistic for some reason).

In fact, we go back quite a bit indeed. The first 7 I had on test came around mid-1995 (I never did drive the E23, the first-generation 7 Series).

That was an E32. A 740i model. It must have been close to being on run out. In that big hissy-barge four of us travelled from Durban to Grahamstown, whence I covered the Grahamstown festival for Scope magazine on whose staff I was in those days. Fun times - even if my definition of fun has dramatically and distinctly changed.

Then came the E38. What a car. It still is. Even if the current 7 Series - which we're getting to - is a quantum leap over this car, which at time was at the pinnacle of automotive tech. I was still with Scope then, and I remember being given an eight-page slot to write about it. My title for the piece? Capitalist Tool.

Next came the E65. The controversial Chris Bangle-designed BMW. For the international launch of the 745iL version I went to Bangkok. And of course over the years I had numerous iterations on test. That was followed by the fifth-generation 7 Series, and that takes us to the all-new sixth-generation incarnation of BMW's flagship, launched recently to the South African media in Cape Town.

Now the press release - and that's just the main press release - is almost 16,000 words long, and there's a massive amount to say about this machine, sitting as it does at the very pinnacle of super saloons. I have only a tiny bit of space here, and the short version is that it's an astoundingly agile big machine, weighing as much as 130kg less than the previous car. It's also laden with technology that borders on science-fiction-like.

Two body variants are available, with

a standard wheelbase at launch, and a long wheelbase due to go on sale a little later this year.

The machine - as we discovered during extensive driving on the launch - is more sumptuous, advanced and beautifully rendered than you can imagine. Yet as you'd expect from a BMW, it's extraordinarily driver-friendly. And as with certain other very good big cars, it seems to shrink around the driver, making it possible to hustle it along like a far smaller vehicle.

But it's the technology that beguiles. Just some of it includes full LED headlights as standard, with the option of BMW Laserlight, which premiered on the i8. The head-up display now provides a 75-percent larger projection on to the windscreen, while safety measures include steering and lane control assistant, lane keeping assistant, and front and rear crossing traffic warning. Indeed, this car is essentially semi-autonomous, and yet another tech highlight is BMW gesture control that allows intuitive and easy interaction with the infotainment system using predefined hand movements.

It rides beautifully, too, thanks to standard two-axle automatic self-levelling air suspension and Dynamic Damper Control as standard, with power running to the rear wheels through an eight-speed gearbox.

On the launch we drove two versions. The three-litre, six-cylinder turbodiesel 730d, and the three-litre, six-cylinder turbopetrol 740i, with a 750i to follow a little later this year - as well as a 740e plug-in hybrid.

Prices are substantial, but not absurd for this category.

The standard 730d - minus options and without delving into the various variants available - starts at R1,365,500. The 740i at R1,339,000. The top-range 750Li, meanwhile, will start at close to two bar.

Just...magnificent - if you're blessed enough to operate at the top end of the automotive market.

Rare Ferrari sells for record price

Cars are often seen as nothing more than a means to get from A to B, which is a sad but true reality as worldwide interest in the motor vehicle diminishes year on year.

However a lot can be said for classic car ownership as a class of assets for investment purposes, especially here in

South Africa - thanks to our particularly weak currency.

In fact there are classic car hunters trawling South Africa looking for prime examples which can be exported for restoration and resale because they come at a fraction of the cost.

Last week saw a world record broken for a price fetched at auction by a car - in this case a 1957 Ferrari 335 S Spider Scaglietti that comes steeped in racing

history, a true one-of-a-kind.

In a sale that generated interest from around the world, the car fetched 28 million euros plus premiums and taxes taking the overall price to just over 32 million euros.

The previous record was held by a 1962 Ferrari 250 GTO sold in 2014 for what was the equivalent of 28.9 million euros.

This specific 335 Spider finished sixth

in the Sebring 12 Hours race in 1957 and second in the Mille Miglia road race in Italy. Later the car was returned to the factory where the engine was rebuilt, in the process increasing capacity from 3.6 to 4.1-litres. The resultant power boost meant it now sported 300kW and a top speed of 300 kilometres an hour.

Legendary British driver, Mike Hawthorn, drove the Spider in the Le Mans 24-hour race in 1957, as if there wasn't already enough awe inspiring history. More recently it was homed in the family collection of late French racing driver Pierre Bardinon.



Granted not many of this kind of classic will be floating around our shores, but it just goes to show what mood the classic car world is in.

Opel Adam S

Sporty and unique

Hurry, only 50 range topping Opel Adam S models have landed on South African shores making it a very limited edition with a price of R330,000.

With 110kW and 220Nm from its turbocharged 1.4-litre Ecotec engine, and an unladen mass of 1,178 kilograms, the Adam S delivers specific output exceeding 74kW/litre. It reaches 100km/h in 8.5 seconds and continues on to 210km/h in fifth gear in just 7.9 seconds.

Available in three distinctive 'Twisted' colour combos: Saturday White Fever, Shiny Rock and Red 'n' Roll. The first two have contrasting red roof and pillars, while the latter has a slate grey upper section.

The 18-inch 'Propeller' wheels have a distinctive five spoke design, with red brake callipers clearly visible. For the first time in an Adam, the exhaust tip - in this instance a chromed, oval one - can be readily seen.

The Adam S is designed with performance in mind, to this end all of the vehicle's external styling features have a benefit:

"The roof-coloured rear wing is the most obvious change and importantly, it adds 100 Newtons of rear downforce at speed.



"A deeper front spoiler performs a similar role to the wing, adding downforce as speed increases to maintain the front/rear aerodynamic balance.

"Side skirts control airflow under the car, helping the Adam S hug the driver's chosen line through sweeping bends.

"The big wheels not only add gravitas by filling the wheel arches to capacity, but their lightweight design reduces unsprung weight and also improves throttle response by minimising inertia.

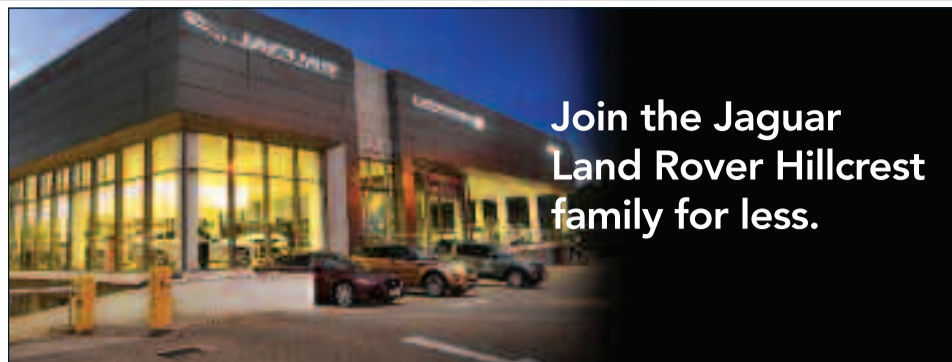
"Premium quality performance tyres measuring 225/35/18 are fitted, and along with the offset of the wheel result in increased track width (1472mm in front and 1 464 at the back) for improved stability.

Under the skin the Adam S boasts a stiffer front anti-roll bar and stiffer springs for improved driving dynamics. In addition Opel has upgraded the brakes to the same specification as the previous-generation Corsa OPC.

The engine meets stringent Euro 6 emission standards, and is equipped with Stop/Start Eco setting.

Other weight-saving features include a cast iron block with a hollow frame structure, hollow-cast camshafts and a plastic intake manifold.

There's a leather-wrapped gear lever knob, while rubber-studded pedals and a thick-rimmed steering wheel make the control interfaces as intimate as possible.

Easing the strain on the water crisis

There are many reasons that attribute to the growing water crisis in South Africa such as climate change, which has affected water supplies within the region. Rains that usually supply the country's water have recently been infrequent. Due to this fact cities are looking to impose water restrictions on communities.

Although South Africa boasts one of the most clean water systems in the world, due to the lack of sanitation and access in the country's rural communities the threat of water borne disease is steadily increasing.

South Africa faces the challenge of deteriorating environmental quality due to pollution and natural resource degradation, destruction and depletion. South Africa is a water-stressed country and it faces an even drier future and climate uncertainty, with cycles of droughts and sudden excessive rains. The health of aquatic ecosystems is declining. Our oceans are increasingly polluted with wastewater, while inland freshwater quality is being degraded by chemical and bacteriological pollution and silting.

What can you do to ease the strain on the water crisis

- Turn-off the tap while brushing teeth, shaving or soaping hands.
- Take shorter showers and use less water if you bath.
- Avoid buying bottled water.
- Sweep outside areas instead of hosing with water.
- Use eco-friendly soaps and cleaning products.
- Fix leaks at home and report public water leaks to the municipality.
- Always use a plugged-sink or bowl instead of a



Water consumption should be monitored closely.

- running tap.
- Insulate hot water pipes to reduce time waiting for water to heat up.
- Install aerators and flow-reducing valves on your taps.
- Install water saving devices on taps, toilets, showers and sprinklers.
- Install a water meter and monitor your use.
- Install an instant water heater at your taps for immediate hot water.
- When washing dishes by hand, don't let the water run while rinsing. Fill one sink with wash water and the other with rinse water.
