

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

y lyk gemaklik en selfversekerd waar sy haar sitplek oorkant myne by 'n knus koffiewinkel in Centurion inneem. Haar lang, blonde hare is vasgesteek in 'n elegante styl; 'n tikkie lipglans rond haar klassieke voorkoms af.

Daar steek egter baie meer agter hierdie aktrise as net 'n stylvolle voorkoms. Sy is bekend vir haar warm, openhartige persoonlikheid.

Dit is gou duidelik, enkele minute in ons gesprek in, dat sy haar reputasie gestand doen... Meer hart as houding, Nadia Beukes is uit-en-uit 'n mensemens.

Juis daarom pas die rol as aanbieder van die uiters gewilde werklikheidsreeks *Boer soek 'n Vrou*, wat nog tot einde verlede jaar op televisieskerms te sien was, haar soos 'n handskoen.

Sy beskryf die vorige seisoen van Boer soek 'n Vrou – haar eerste as aanbieder vir dié program – as 'n verrykende ervaring wat haar menswees geskaaf het.

"Ek het onder andere ontdek dat jy moet blom waar jy geplant is en dat 'n windpomp nie vir wind gaan soek nie, maar bly staan. Mense is oor die algemeen soekend, maar as jy weet wie jy is en waarin jy glo en vasstaan in daardie wete, dan sal jy doen wat jy moet wanneer die wind waai. Dit het my bygebly. Die ervaring het my ook hoop gegee en my weer laat glo in liefde."

Die opneem van dié program, tussen Maart en Oktober verlede jaar, was 'n afgesonderde tydperk vir die stadsjapie, wat ongeveer 35 000km per voertuig afgelê het tussen die verskillende plase regoor Suid-Afrika.

"Op die pad is daar baie alleentyd; oomblikke waar jy net weer stil word en jouself beter leer ken. Dit het my geleer dat 'n mens eintlik baie minder dinge nodig het as wat jy dink. Aanvanklik het ek baie gepak," lag sy, "maar deur die proses het ek al hoe ligter begin reis en besef ek het nie alles nodig nie."

Dit is juis hierdie waarheid wat dit vir haar maklik gemaak het om onlangs vir haar huis in Weltevredenpark, wat sy vir Centurion verruil het om nader aan die werk te wees, 'n nuwe baadjie aan te trek

"Dit was omtrent 'n "full-on home make-over." Ek het baie dinge weggegee en daar is geskuur en geskaaf en geverf. Ek het meer helder en ligter kleure ingebring en dit is vir my lekker om nou by die huis in te stap. Dit was tyd," lag sy.

Dit is heeltemal in lyn met die seisoen waarin Nadia haarself tans

bevind, 'n seisoen van nuwe dinge in ligter, helder kleure. Is 'n nuwe liefde dalk een van hierdie dinge?

"Ek is beslis 'n romantikus, ek glo absoluut in liefde en wil graag die moontlikheid daarvan 'n kans gee. Ek het onlangs 'n besondere lekker Valentysdag gehad – 'n vyfgangmaaltyd by Stephanies in Lynnwood Bridge, gevolg deur 'n Jak de Priestervertoning by Atterbury-teater...," sê sy geheimsinnig.

Alhoewel sy nie te veel wil verklap oor wat in haar persoonlike lewe aangaan nie, is dit voor die hand liggend dat haar loopbaan wel kleurryk aan die blom is.

Buiten dat sy weer vanjaar die rol as aanbieder van *Boer soek 'n Vrou* inneem, is daar ook rolle in *Getroud met Rugby* en 7de Laan, en heel moontlik Sterlopers.

Nadia is ook besig met stemwerk vir 'n navorsingsprojek deur die WNNR, wat die potensiaal van 'n rekenaar om emosie te kan kommunikeer, ondersoek. Musiekliefhebbers kan uitsien na 'n duet van Nadia en Riaan Grobler, wat later vanjaar opgeneem word.

Die blondekop wil ook nog vanjaar teaterwerk aanpak.

"As ek in die posisie is waar ek 'n boodskap kan oordra wat 'n positiewe impak het, dan voel dit of alles in plek val, of my lewe sin maak. Maar ek sou beslis nie hier gewees het sonder sekere verhoudings nie. My verhouding met KykNET is veral vir my belangrik. Hulle doen soveel vir Afrikaans – van die platforms wat hulle vir programme skep tot hul betrokkenheid by kunstefeeste. Ek is ook ongelooflik bevoorreg om 'n agent soos Jennis Williamson te hê, wat net van die begin af gesê het, "Let's do this'."

Behalwe vir haar loopbaanprojekte en werksverhoudings, waar lê die aktrise se hart? "Definitief by mense. Ek het 'n tribe van wonderlike mense in my lewe, vriende en familie, waarsonder ek nie kan funksioneer nie en ek kan hulle op my twee hande tel. Daardie mense is deur dik en dun saam my en ek sal enigiets vir hulle doen. Ek het baie lank gesukkel om daardie groep mense in my lewe te identifiseer waar ek net myself kan wees. Jy wil so graag by almal inpas, wil so graag hê almal moet van jou hou, jou aanvaar en liefhê, maar as jy so hard moet werk om iemand se affection te kry, is dit partykeer ten koste van jouself. Maar as mense jou kan waardeer net soos jy is, is dit iets waaraan ek met altwee hande sal vashou..."

Gepraat van verhoudings, ervaar sy ooit druk om in 'n sekere boksie in te pas? Om 'n prentjie te moet hê wat 'n man, een-en-'n halwe kinders en 'n groot hond insluit?

"Verseker, maar ek het geleer dat mense se prentjies verskil. En net omdat my prentjie anders is, beteken dit nie dit is slegter of beter as iemand anders s'n nie. Daar is in elke situasie negatiewe en positiewe, dit is waar die hele ding inpas van blom waar jy geplant is, om die seisoen waarin jy jouself bevind, regtig aan te gryp en die meeste daarvan te maak. Want daar is dinge om te leer en te ervaar in daardie seisoen en om heeltyd te wens jy is nie daar nie, gaan veroorsaak dat jy dit mis. Ek het dit vir baie lank gedoen, want ek het probeer om te wees wat ander mense wou gehad het ek moet wees. Ek het ook gevoel ek skiet te kort, want in sekere aspekte is ek nog nie waar ek gedink het ek wou wees nie..."

Sy lag spontaan, sterre in haar oë. "Maar wat is die kans dat ek in 'n fliek sou speel, dat ek 'n werklikheidsreeks sou aanbied? Want ek het nog altyd daardie drome in my hart gekoester, maar ek het nie drama gaan swot nie en het nie die standaard paadjie geloop om daarby uit te kom nie. So ek moes regtig my pad oopveg en hard werk. Te danke aan God se groot genade en soveel onverdiende ondersteuning het ek dit reggekry om my drome te kan uitleef. Juis daarom kan ek getuig drome word waar!"

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Hoekom juis fotografie? Waar het hierdie kreatiewe passie sy vertrekpunt gekry?

Ek wou nog altyd iets kunstig aanpak en jare gelede het ek die verfkwas probeer, maar dit vat net te lank en ek het nie die geduld daarvoor nie. Nadat ek eendag my vrou in Bazaruto-eilande afgeneem het met 'n mik-en-druk, het ek besef dat ek wel prentjies kon maak en sedertdien was dit net een amazing reis.

Wat is vir jou die lekkerste 'lekker' van foto's neem? Enigiets wat jou teen die mure wil uitdryf?

Die lekkerste is om mense te sien goed voel oor hulself, hul verhoudings en families – om mense net gelukkig te sien. Wat my teen die mure uitdryf is die feit dat almal deesdae glo hulle is fotograwe. Ek dink in 'n mate is ons almal fotonemers, maar om jouself dan 'n fotograaf te noem omdat jy al een mooi foto geneem het...dit krap nogal.

Jy het wye ervaring agter die blad, tog kan enigeen 'n fout maak. Het jy al enige groot flaters begaan waaroor jy nou lekker kan lag?

Om by 'n fotosessie aan te kom sonder jou kamera, of om die batterye of

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memory card te vergeet, is 'n groot verleentheid. As daar een flater is wat mens deur die dak dryf, is dit wanneer jy 'n foto geneem het en eers later besef dit was nie 100% in fokus nie. Dit is 'n groot oops!

Jy het al verskeie *celebs* afgeneem, waaronder Bobby en Karlien van Jaarsveld, Hykie Berg en Bok van Blerk. Met watter bekende persoonlikheid het jy tot dusver die meeste geniet om saam te werk?

Dit klink soos 'n strikvraag. Ek dink ek sal die sertifikaat vir Kevin Leo moet gee. Nie net het ek en hy vriende geword nie, maar hy is altyd dieselfde. Of hy nou in *celeb mode* of in sy eie persoonlike spasie is, Kevin Leo is altyd dieselfde. Ek het so baie *celebs* al afgeneem, ek wens soms die mense daar buite kan hulle sien wanneer hulle net hulself is.

Wat is vir jóú die bestanddele vir 'n perfekte foto?

Lig, passie, emosie, 'n storie en dan daardie x-faktor wat mens net nie kan beskryf nie.

Wat is jou wenke aan vroue om mooi te voel en lyk voor die kamera?

Dit het my baie jare geneem om uit te vind wat die skoner geslag sexy maak en die antwoord is ongetwyfeld selfvertroue. As 'n kamera naby jou kom, dames, strike a pose en kyk met selfvertroue na die lens. Dit is alles in die oë.

Wat dink jy van selfies?

Nie geweet ek sal eendag 'n mening moet lug oor selfies nie...maar wag, laat ek dink. Ek dink my tienerdogter sal graag wil hê ek moet sê dit is cool. So my amptelike mening van selfies? Dit is cool.

Wat is heel bo-aan jou bucket list van foto's wat jy nog wil neem?

Charlize Theron. Dit is nou een vrou wat ek beslis graag wil afneem. Ek wil deur al die *ropes* gaan – grimering, *location*, hare, ongelooflike klere en dan om daardie *look* van haar deur my kamera te kan sien...dan kan ek maar doodgaan (grappie).

Wanneer jy nie agter die kamera is nie, wie is Albert? Wat geniet jy om te doen?

As ek nie 'n kamera by my het nie, dan is ek eerste die man van 'n *awesome* vrou wat baie *stunning* is (ek wens ek

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kan haar meer afneem) en dan is ek pa van twee kinders, Aidan (7) en Danike (17). Ek is 'n internet junkie, iphone addict, baie slegte drawwer en dan om te ontspan is daar vir my niks lekkerder as 'n goeie fliek nie. Ek is mal oor mense en om mense gelukkig te maak; ek vind verseker my geluk in ander se geluk.

Wat was jou mees onvergeetlike fotosessie nog?

Dit was ongetwyfeld die fotosessie saam met die vroue wat hul hare afgeskeer het vir hul vriendin, Gerdi Mckenna, wat aan kanker gely het. Al die gepaardgaande emosies wat tydens daardie fotosessie geheers het, en ook

toe die video viral gegaan het, is iets wat ek nooit sal vergeet nie.

n the surface Chantelle Bothma might appear to be just another leggy model with a megawatt smile – the quintessential pageant beauty with big dreams of making it in Hollywood one day.

I believe that it's pointless

being a pretty package if you

are just an empty box.

Except that she's not. Although this model-cum-aspiring-actress (cum-the-list-goes-on) might move in these very social circles, her focus isn't on all the glitz, glam and stardom. No, her real passion lies with people and inspiring them – especially a younger generation.

"Perhaps that is why I've always felt that I'm not crazy about it when people refer to me as a model, because as soon as someone hears you are a model, they tend to stereotype and place you in a box. And now I'm blonde as well, so they label me very quickly. They immediately think I'm this doll face, this *poppie*," she grins, with a twinkle in her eye.

"Which couldn't be further from the truth, I mean, growing up I was a tomboy who played in the dirt, baked mud cakes and

climbed trees. My point is, there's so much more to me than just a pretty face who walks down a runway – that's why I don't want people to see me as a model, but as a role model."

The 24-year-old excitedly explains how she discovered this passion of hers.

"As a child I was very shy and withdrawn. To draw me out of my shell, my mom enrolled me at finishing school. It was here where modelling, and later pageantry, first piqued my interest."

Over the years Chantelle met various young girls in the pageant industry,

soon realising there are plenty of insecurities behind-the-scenes. It was while comforting a young girl, who was heartbroken and in tears because she didn't win, that Chantelle had her big 'aha' moment....

"I realised that perhaps my purpose wasn't to walk away with a crown, but to inspire these girls and show them that you don't need a title to make a difference."

Today Chantelle, who also works as a part-time graphic designer and is studying a BCom in Marketing Management through Unisa, is devoted to a number of causes involving youngsters.

A young girl who lies especially close to her heart is Nelmarie Korff, who is fighting a rare cancer called Rhabdomyosarcoma. Chantelle came across the 8-year-old's story on Facebook and immediately felt drawn to the little girl. 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

Many companies offer to pay for their employees to go on courses that will better their ability asset," she says. If there is no such person, there's always the internet. Lastly, be proud of your achievements and don't eat too much humble pie. Keep a log of all the

things you've achieved in your job so that when you're feeling down, you can look back on

these achievements and feel confident in your abilities.

Learn to accept compliments. Rather than shyly responding with 'It was nothing', acknowledge what you've achieved and be proud of it.






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April is synonymous with Easter eggs and chocolate bunnies. With all these treats on offer, it can be tempting to eat for all the wrong reasons. Here's how to say no to emotional eating.

his month there are plenty of leisurely long weekends spent with friends and relatives to look forward to. Think indulgent family lunches, Easter egg hunts and more chocolate bunnies than you can count. However, these family affairs can be quite emotional – and it can be tempting to eat for all the wrong reasons. Top dietician Ajita Ratanjee from Easy Health Wellness studio in Moreleta Park sheds some light on the issue and provides simple advice on how you can resist falling into the trap of emotional eating.

What is emotional eating?

According to Ajita, emotional triggers are the underlying reason why many

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women aren't able to see the results of successful weight loss efforts.

Eating due to emotional triggers, referred to as 'emotional eating', is when eaters seek comfort from food instead of relief from physical hunger.

"The problem is the relief experienced from eating that piece of cake, ice cream or potato chips is only temporary. Furthermore, you'll experience feelings of guilt and remorse after bingeing, which will lead to negative thought cycles and hinder you from getting back on track."

The most common emotional triggers are feeling bored, lonely, anxious, frustrated, depressed, angry or stressed. Other triggers can run much deeper and as far back as a childhood





experience, or even something someone said.

There's good news though

The good news is that you can learn how to cope with these emotional triggers so that you're not constantly reaching for that chocolate slab or bag of chips when you're feeling down.

A good place to start is to figure out what triggers your eating behaviour.

When you know what situations and emotions prompt you to eat, you can come up with ways to steer clear of those traps. According to Ajita, emotional food triggers typically fall into five main categories.

The five food triggers (and how to sidestep them)

*Social

Beware of social situations where you might be encouraged to overeat simply because you're unconsciously copying others or trying to fit in. Be conscious of this trigger whenever you're in social surroundings. The best advice is to listen to your body and eat accordingly.

*Fatigue/anxiety

This entails eating in response to unpleasant feelings like fatigue and anxiety, or to fill the void due to loneliness. Instead of trying to solve the

problem with food, go to the emotional root and sort that out. Feeling anxious? Pack away the potato chips and brainstorm a practical solution to your problem instead.

*Negative thoughts

A negative self-image and a constant barrage of negative thoughts can make you want to reach for that guilty pleasure. Again, the trick here is to focus on the emotional issue at hand. Refuse to listen to that negative voice and rather replace any negative thoughts with positive ones.

*Situational

In this instance, one eats simply because the opportunity is there, like when you pass a bakery or do certain activities like watch a cooking show. If you know you're at a place where you're struggling with emotional eating, avoid walking past the bakery and take an alternative route instead. And skip the *Barefoot Contessa*'s version of a mocha chocolate cake and tune into a riveting dramedy instead.

*Physiological

This food trigger, eating in response to physical cues, such as a headache or an appetite increased because you skipped a meal, is perfectly normal. No need to sidestep this one.

More practical tips An effective way to refrain from

emotional eating is to form new thought patterns. "'A great way to do this is to keep a diary of what you eat and jot down your accompanying emotions next to it," suggests Ajita. Patterns will soon emerge from this basic exercise.

The next step is to break the habit. When you reach for food in response to an eating trigger, try one of the following activities:

*Go for a walk or jog.

*Do deep breathing exercises.

*Talk to a friend.

*Distract yourself with a fun activity like reading a good book or magazine, listening to music or doing a crossword or Sudoku puzzle.

The urge to eat will soon pass. As you practice better coping strategies and curb emotional eating, remember to reward yourself. By patting yourself on the back for a job well done, you increase the likelihood that you'll maintain your new healthy habits.

It might also help to write down ten reasons why you want to lose weight. "This is a great tool that I usually recommend to my clients. It helps them focus on the benefits they'll experience from weight loss and reminds them why they started," says Ajita. Should you still find yourself on an uphill battle, counselling might be the next step.

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

DELICATE BEAUTY

Summer is lingering languidly in the air and winter's chill is not quite here yet, making April's autumn weather perfect for a little rest and relaxation in the garden. Give your garden a touch of old-school romance with a few stunning April roses in shades of delicate pink, soft cream and a tinge of peach.



oses have long inspired poets and lovers from around the world. Their wonderfully intense, sweet fragrance is intoxicating, and few flowers can compete with this queen of the garden.

Gentle colours, romantic appeal and a profusion of beautiful blooms make roses the ideal flower to fend off the winter blues and add some life to a dull garden.

"Nothing is more romantic than the full-petalled, old-fashioned roses of yesteryear, and that is the charm of the Antico Moderno roses. They are a mix of old and new, combining nostalgic flower shapes with the vigour and disease resistance of modern roses. Most have soft colours and a noticeable fragrance," says rose grower extraordinaire Ludwig Taschner from the well-known Ludwig's Roses just north of Pretoria.

The blooms of Antico Moderno roses are carried upright on strong, straight stems and their petals are firm and will not drop off with the first wind or rain.

These flowers are long lasting, both on the bush and in the vase, says Ludwig.

He suggests two varieties in particular for maximum impact: the Fragonard, a cup-shaped pink rose that has won several awards for the best perfumed rose, and the Relais and Chateaux, which boasts beautiful shoulder-high blooms in shades of cream and a delicate tinge of pink flowing into a soft peach.

"Our mild autumn weather is ideal for planting roses because they focus on making new roots, even if frost arrives in May, and they will be well-established flowering plants by October," he says.

Ludwig warns that gardeners should water their new roses with

"During April and May water the roses about twice a week, reducing this to once a week in June. There is no need to fertilise, because roses go dormant in winter, so are not affected by frost. Winter prune in mid-July, fertilise and as it gets warmer, increase watering. Roses planted in April should only be lightly pruned."

Not sure how to use your roses to decorate your home? For a vintage look, arrange blooms loosely



in antique glass bottles, bowls, tea pots and jugs. "Don't forget to add foliage. Trailing variegated ivy and asparagus fern are delicate enough and add a relaxing note of green. Sprigs of lavender or rosemary add an interesting texture as well as fragrance and a country garden appeal," our expert explains.

For more tips and tricks to perfect the art of rose growing, visit Ludwig's Roses in Haakdoornlaagte, just a stone's throw from the capital, or www. ludwigsroses.co.za.

If you're feeling inspired to do a little rose planting of your own, be sure to keep the following in mind:

- · Roses need at least 6 hours of sun, so don't plant them in an overly shady spot of the garden.
- Prepare the new bed or individual hole a few days before planting. Shovel the top 30cm of soil to the side and mix

in compost, organic material, a little fertiliser and a handful of bonemeal. Loosen the subsoil (the soil lying) immediately under the surface) to a depth of 20-30cm, adding more compost, organics and bonemeal.

- · Return the enriched topsoil to the hole. The level of the rose bed you've prepared should be about 10cm higher than it was before. Water this thoroughly and leave for a few days.
- When you're ready, place your plant in the hole, making sure the bud union (point where the plant has been grafted, usually indicated by a small, knoblike growth) is only 5-6 cm below the level of the bed.
- Once the plant is positioned correctly, fill in the soil and firm it to get rid of air pockets. Form a basin around each plant and water with about 20 litres. After 3 weeks, level out the basin and apply mulch (decaying leaves, bark, or compost used to enrich and insulate the soil) to the bed.

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
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
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
